New York (UPI)—Stocks rallied today until the last hour when new profit taking developed and drove the list down from its highs. At the best levels of the day, the industrial average had shown a recovery of about half of Wednesday's losses. At their highs gains running to three points appeared in such stocks as Westinghouse Electric, White Motors, Seibler Rubber, Motorola, Montana Power, Walt Disney, American Machine and Metals, Maytag, International Salt, National Acme and Philadelphia Reading.

Youth Conservation Program Proposed

Washington (UPI)—Congress was asked today to establish a 150,000-member youth conservation corps. Sponsors of identical bills in the House and Senate said the plan would "put young brain and muscle to work on a broad scale in the field of conservation."

Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn.) said the idea would pay for itself in terms of "urgently needed" protection of natural resources. "I also would act as a powerful influence toward preventing juvenile delinquency," he said.

Rep. John A. Blatnik (D-Minn.) supported the proposal by introducing a companion bill in the House. The legislation would make it possible for youths between 16 and 22 to work in federal and state forests and parks. They would receive pay of \$78 a month.

Youngster Slays Four in Family

Auburn, N. Y. (UPI)—A high school sophomore who nursed grudges against his family shot and killed his father, mother, brother and sister. Police said he confessed to the slayings early today.

John Jayne, 16-year-old farmboy, apparently shot each of them twice—the second shot a kind of coup de grace. "I didn't want to see them suffer," he told police.

John, according to his confession, bore a grudge against his parents for a whipping he got last summer. He also carried a grudge against Willard and believed his sister sided with his older brother.

One inch of new snow was reported at Crater Lake National park during the 24 hours ending at 8 o'clock this morning. The total depth is 63 inches. Chains are advised on the south and west entrances, and required from Annie Springs to the rim, the park service said.

Sweetland Offers Scholarship Bill

Salem (UPI)—Sen. Monroe Sweetland (D-Milwaukie) introduced a bill providing scholarships to state colleges and universities for Oregon students.

Under terms of his bill, each member of the Legislature would be entitled to issue one scholarship and each county in the state also would be entitled to one. No scholarship could be more than \$200 in value. An appropriation of \$80,000 to finance the scholarships during the next biennium is included in the bill.
