

### Filipinos Protest Magazine Article

Manila—(UPI)—About 50 Filipinos paraded past the American embassy in jeeps today to protest against an American magazine article which called President Carlos P. Garcia "luxury-loving."

Placards carried on the jeeps and loudspeakers denounced the article in Time magazine.

"Time lies . . . Time stinks," the placards said, as the demonstrators, reading prepared statements said "we are not anti-American as Time has claimed."

The magazine article caused a flareup in the Philippine Congress Thursday with the pro-government faction denouncing it and some members of the opposition Liberal party defending it as being factual.

### The Medical Roundup

Hiatus Hernia or Diaphragmatic Hernia

Hundreds of thousands of persons are born with a little too much space around the gullet where it goes through the diaphragm.

and down the stomach. Occasionally, in such persons, a little bit of the stomach will go up into the chest cavity. Usually, this produces no symptoms and hence need occasion no concern, but in a few cases it produces some pain or discomfort, especially when the person tries to tie his shoelaces right after eating a large meal. I would rather put with it than run the risk of undergoing a difficult operation to tighten the hole. Actually, it is many years since I saw a patient who, I thought, really needed the operation. One woman who had severe symptoms was perfectly comfortable after she followed my suggestion and, by eating wisely, took 60 pounds off her large abdomen.

In many cases of supposed diaphragmatic hernia, what the patient really has is a short esophagus (gullet). As a result of this his stomach begins not under the diaphragm, but where it should begin, but an inch or so above. In such a case I see little sense in a surgeon's trying to pull the stomach down. The point I keep making to the patients of this type whom I see is that so long as their little hernia (rupture) or short esophagus doesn't bother them, why have it operated on? I recently saw a man who, 15 years ago, had an unwise operation performed for a hiatus hernia. What was unfortunate was that the surgeon did not note that the man's symptoms were not those of an impending nervous breakdown, such as his father had had. As the result of the operative shock, the man, who was able to work before the operation, has never since been able to do anything.

**Surgeons More Careful**

In the old days, when a person asked how dangerous the operation was a surgeon was likely to say, "Oh, don't worry at all; this is a safe operation." But today, after many nasty lawsuits in which the surgeon was sued for having made a promise which he could not keep, he is more careful in his statements. Perhaps the patient had some unforeseen accident, like a pneumonia, or a "pulmonary embolism," due to the (rare) clotting of blood in a vein and the washing off of this clot

into the lung. Today all wise surgeons say that any operation, and even any anesthetic, carries with it certain dangers. Once in a hundred or a thousand cases, something unforeseen can go wrong, usually because of some peculiar sensitiveness or weakness of the patient.

For instance, a while ago one of my friends decided to have a rupture in his groin repaired surgically. He did not worry about it because he knew the chances of his dying after such an operation were perhaps only one in 200.

But my friend was stout and a heavy smoker, and apparently his blood had an abnormal tendency to clot. Anyway, a few days after the operation, he got a clot in one of his veins, and some of this clot started washing off and running up into his lungs where it plugged up some of the blood vessels. With this, he all but died. He recovered but the experience left him aged before his time. None of this misfortune could be blamed on the surgeon or the anesthetist because the man was operated on in a university hospital where he had the best of care.

It is his experience with cases like this which causes all scrupulously honest surgeons to say to many a patient, "I would prefer not to operate on you unless you begin to have symptoms so disturbing that you will accept any risk rather than go on with your distress."

**Hope for a Few Persons With Strokes**

Of late, it has been found that some persons with a stroke have had a clot firm in the internal carotid artery, a big artery in the neck which supplies blood to much of the brain. A series of such cases was recently reported by Drs. M. M. Keirns, and J. E. Whiteleather. Sometimes an experienced physician can guess from the nature of the symptoms that the clot is in this carotid artery. X-ray films can then be made of the arteries of the brain after injecting a substance-opaque to x-rays—into the artery in the neck. In some of these cases the patient can be greatly helped by an able specialist in arterial surgery who will take out the clot.

I must say here that such an operation should be performed soon after the stroke. I get any number of letters from the sons or daughters of old people who are still crippled after a bad stroke experienced two or three or four years ago, and regretfully, I have to say that after that length of time I doubt if any medicine or any procedure will do any good.

She is one of the group whose researches overthrew the law of the conservation of parity concerned with the spin of elementary particles, rated a top achievement in 1957 recognized by a Nobel award. This is the 23rd awarding of this prize and in addition the Research Corporation distributes \$1,200,000 to support research in colleges.

**Stock Market Uses Giant Projection Lens**

Rochester, N. Y. — (Science Service)—A giant 60-pound projection lens manufactured by Bausch & Lomb Optical Company here has been installed in the New York Stock Exchange's Wall Street headquarters as part of a projection system for showing ticker tape quotations and bids on a screen. Nearly a foot in diameter and more than a foot in length, the lens has a focal length of 38 inches with an f/4 opening. It focuses sharply data from the standard 3 1/2-inch tape onto a large wall screen on the other side of the Exchange floor. The projection is magnified to 14 feet in length, with the individual letters and figures enlarged to two feet in height.
