Pickets Stick At Springfield

Springfield —(UPI)— Roving pickets from the Coos Bay area remained at the gates of the Weyerhaeuser Timber company's Springfield plant for the second day in a row Friday.

About 1,000 workers were idled here as members of the Coos Bay local of the International Woodworkers of America union continued to protest the firing of a truck driver last week.

Pickets also returned Tuesday to the Weyerhaeuser operations at Aberdeen and Grays Harbor, Wash., idling 840 sawmill workers and loggers.

Californian Cited For Rule Violation

The group pleaded for approval of a 10-year six billion dollar program of slum clearance and urban renewal, instead of the six-year \$1,350,000,000 program proposed by President Eisenhower.

Mrs. Wanamaker Awarded Damages

Washington —(UPI)—A federal court jury yesterday awarded \$145,000 to Mrs. Pearl Wanamaker in her million dollar libel suit against radio commentator Fulton Lewis.

The Mutual Broadcasting System and radio station WWDC here were co-defendants with Lewis in the case.

The suit grew out of a broadcast made by Lewis in January, 1956. At that time Mrs. Wanamaker was superintendent of public instruction in Washington state.

Lewis' comment referred to Mrs. Wanamaker's part in the 1955 White House conference on education and in a controversy involving teachers in Washington state.

Pamphlets Popular With Area Library Patrons

Pamphlets, because they are often more attractive and ahead of book publications on the same subjects, are becoming increasingly popular with patrons of the Jackson County library, according to Miss Joyce Marlin, reference librarian.

Miss Marlin cited, for example, such frequently requested topics as juvenile delinquency, narcotics, alcoholism, civilian defense, and rehabilitation of the disabled. Other popular subjects are atomic power, conservation, social security, national parks and raising pears and apples.

The paper-covered booklets, which can be taken out on a library card like a book, are available not only in the reference section of the Medford Public Library headquarters but in branch libraries at Central Point, Jacksonville, Gold Hill, Talent, and Eagle Point. The booklets are always brief—ranging from one to five pages—and often more up-to-date and readable.

Some of the most attractive pamphlets are those published by the experiment stations of the various state agricultural colleges. Pamphlets are also available from such publishers as Public Affairs committee, Foreign Policy association, and various departments of the state and federal governments.

Biggest users of the pamphlet file are students, who locate material for term papers and debates. Businessmen, club women, homemakers, and other library users also find information on a wide variety of subjects.

It is expected that the pamphlet collection will have especially frequent use during Oregon's Centennial anniversary since it contains a great deal of material on state and local history not available in any other form.
