

Quick Passage of Airport Building Program Pushed

Washington—(AP)—The Senate pushed toward quick passage today of a \$565 million Democratic airport construction bill which President Eisenhower has branded as extravagant.

Supporters have hailed it as essential to air safety.

The chamber started action on the measure after dealing Eisenhower's economy campaign a sharp rebuke late Thursday night by approving 60 to 28 a \$2,637,000,000 bill, \$1 billion higher than he asked. The measure now goes to the House.

New Version
The airport measure is a new version of an aid proposal the President vetoed last year as too costly. It would provide \$100 million in each of five years to be parcelled out to the states 75 per cent on the basis of population

and 25 per cent on the basis of need.

It also would set aside another \$65 million to be used at any time during the five years to help build longer runways and other facilities for jet-age travel. States or municipalities would have to match all federal money dollar-for-dollar.

Ike's Proposal
Eisenhower proposed a four-year, \$200 million airport program. The President and other Republicans have said the Democratic measure would provide money for terminals and other items not directly involved with flight. But Chairman A. S. Mike Monroney (D-Okla.) of the Senate aviation subcommittee denied today that there were any frills in the bill. He said the legislation was needed to make air travel safer.

Other congressional news:
Civil Rights: Southerners attacked sections of Eisenhower's civil rights proposals designed to encourage communities to desegregate their schools. One called for legislation to make it a federal crime to use force or threats of force to obstruct court orders in school desegregation cases. The other would give federal financial and technical aid to help areas with integration problems. But there were growing indications that Congress probably would pass some civil rights law this year.

Budget: Sen. George Aiken (R-Vt.) said Eisenhower's battle for a balanced budget was not "a winning fight." The liberal Republican said the President should economize by eliminating waste and plugging tax loopholes instead of "taking it out on the little folks" by trimming programs. But the GOP Senate leadership stiffened its resistance to Democratic spending proposals.

Information: Chairman William L. Dawson (D-Ill.) of the House Government Operations Committee ordered his government information subcommittee to investigate the Navy's refusal to give a full copy of a study on the Military Sea Transport Service to the General Accounting Office. The Navy has said publication of the study would cause its inspectors to be less frank in future reports.

Hawaii Union Organizer To Face Probers

Washington—(AP)—Senate investigators planned today to question a Teamsters Union organizer who stirred up a storm in sunny Hawaii last year.

The organizer, Mike Singer, was described as teamsters President James R. Hoffa's "best friend" in Los Angeles. But some Honolulu businessmen consider him "persona non grata."

Varied Activities
According to the committee, Los Angeles Local 626 sent Singer to Honolulu to organize some meat companies. But a committee spokesman said Singer's tactics included halting milk deliveries for two days, picketing the docks and bringing pressure on meat suppliers on the mainland.

Small Business Administrator Wendell B. Barnes was scheduled to testify about the effects of Singer's Honolulu junket on some firms there.

Committee Counsel Robert F. Kennedy said other witnesses would be called to discuss Singer's handling of union funds and some of his business activities.

Winner Refused Post
Singer was named in testimony Thursday as one of the teamsters who tried to keep a rebellious member of Los Angeles Local 208 from ousting a Hoffa-backed officer.

Sidney Cohen, former 208 president, testified that he won an election last month to unseat John W. Filippoff as secretary-treasurer. But Filippoff, he said, refused to recognize defeat.

Cohen said he finally yielded to pressure from Hoffa's lieutenants and agreed to resign the post at a meeting here. But when he returned home he had a change of heart and still is trying to make his election victory stick.

Eisenhower Plans Day of Hunting

Thomasville, Ga.—(AP)—President Eisenhower, barring a return of the winter rains, planned another day in the hunting fields today.

The President spent seven hours Thursday roaming the piney acreage of former Secretary George H. Humphrey's estate. He returned to his guest cottage with a full bag of quail for the day.

Press Secretary James C. Hagerty said the President and Humphrey shot 20 quail between them Thursday. Barry Liethead and William E. Robinson, two corporation presidents and old friends of Eisenhower, were along as spectators.

The forecast called for cloudy, mild weather today, ideal conditions for quail hunting.
