Something New, Old Is Theme on SOC Campus

Ashland—"Something new and something old" is the theme for Southern Oregon college these days as Medford Architect Robert J. Keeney was appointed to draw up plans for a new \$520,000 dormitory for women, and a search for the bones of a prehistoric mammoth unearthed on campus last week was continued.

To be located south of the recently-completed Siskiyou hall for men, and east of Indiana st., the structure will provide housing accommodations for more than 150 students. Food service will be available in the Commons building which was completed last year.

With the present enrollment standing at an all-time high of 1,061 for any winter term, and a conservative enrollment estimate of more than 4,500 students by 1970, Elmo N. Stevenson, college president, pointed out that all graduates, southern Oregon citizens, and he is vitally concerned with the continuance of the current building program for the college.

"This is true of all state-supported institutions of higher education throughout Oregon," Dr. Stevenson explained, "but our situation here is unusually critical in view of the fact that southern Oregon is one of the fastest growing areas in the state."
