Individual gains in the list ran past four points in some of the leaders and gave the whole market a bright look. Lukens Steel paced its group with a gain running past four points. Other issues in the steel group generally added fractions. Maytag also added around four at its best on a good earnings report.

DuPont was up almost four in the chemicals. Motors met good support. American Motors, Ford, and General Motors all added a point or better. Nonferrous metals, enjoying a stronger price structure, had a number of issues up a point or more, including Alcoa, Anaconda, and Magma Copper.
