

March of Dimes Receipts Reported

Reports of March of Dimes receipts have been received from two Jackson county communities, Jerry Gastineau, county chairman of the National Foundation, announced today.

Phoenix, under direction of Edward Stevens, collected \$835.48 and Jacksonville, with Mrs. John Crabbe as chairman, collected \$249.62, Gastineau said.

Financial statement report forms have been mailed to all county communities which participated in the March of Dimes drive and figures will be released when the reports are received at his office, the county chairman said.

Although the campaign officially ended on Jan. 31, there are a few projects yet to be carried out, he said. Projects for which the sponsors could not find time during January will be held in February. Included are the wheelbarrow race downtown Saturday between the Lions club and Kiwanis club and the all-county dance at the Medford armory on Feb. 21. No new fund-raising projects are being scheduled, Gastineau said.

Husbands Who Want to See Their Baby Born

Today, a number of husbands are demanding that they be admitted to the department of obstetrics to see their child born, and a number of obstetricians are objecting strongly.

As they say, they can't stand to see their wife in pain, and they can't stand to see their wife in pain.

Some teachers of obstetrics ask the wife if she much wants her husband present, and are then guided by her feelings in the matter.

People Who Are Cold-Blooded or Warm-Blooded

Women write asking why some of the members in their family want to keep the temperature in the house above 80 degrees while others are uncomfortable as soon as the temperature gets above 70 degrees.

A wife may want to pile the comforter onto her bed, while her husband may want to kick them all off.

I imagine that some persons are just naturally more sensitive to cold or heat than others are. If there is any marked abnormality, the person ought to get an estimate of the basal metabolic rate, usually done with a so-called breathing test. This gives an idea of whether the thyroid gland is functioning too much or too little. If it is functioning too much, the person will feel cold.

I once made a diagnosis of hypothyroidism, or so-called myxedema, with one glance at an elderly man sitting in my office. I noticed that on a hot July day he was wearing big Minnesota winter galoshes! When I asked him why, he said he felt terribly cold, and when I got his basal metabolic rate measured, it was down around minus 40 per cent. When some thyroid substance was given him, he felt like a new man.

Dr. Alvarez hopes his readers will understand that it would be impossible for him to answer requests for information or to attempt to diagnose by mail.

Competition Rules Tax Cuts Out

Tokyo—UPI—Eric Johnston, president of the Motion Picture Association of America, said Tuesday there can be no tax cuts for Americans if the United States is to compete successfully with the challenge of Communism.

Johnston told a Japanese-American audience here that complacency by the United States and the free world could lead to disaster.

Japanese Prime Minister Nobusuke Kishi attended the lunch in honor of Johnston in the Imperial Hotel but left before the latter spoke.

Johnston said the challenge of Communist competition leaves only one road open to the United States.

"It means that we must break with the past and search out new ways and methods. Too frequently in the past, we in the free world have been like the dogs of Russian scientists and have reacted with conditioned reflexes at the sound of the Kremlin Bell."

Johnston said the time has come "for us to develop new ideas and make the free world so strong that it can neither be splintered, eroded or capsize by any total state no matter what tactics it may employ."
