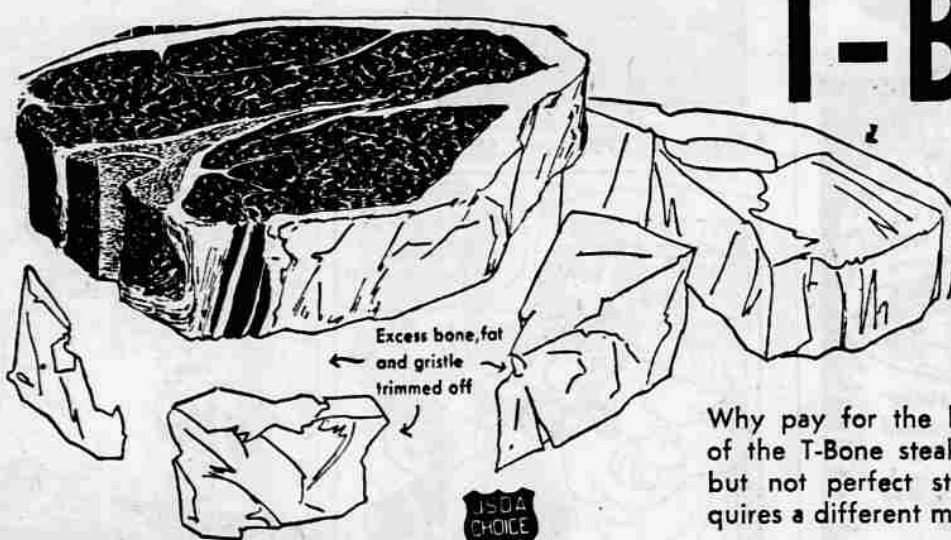

A Silent Army All Victorious
Talk about over-population! Insects comprise 90 per cent of all living things upon our globe.

Every square inch of the earth's surface has its complement of wriggling, crawling creatures classified under the all embracing erroneous name of "bugs."

It is a silent army, living on the land, infiltrating every nook and crevice, occupying every strategic position, winning every engagement! creatures whose life cycles are so rapid that several generations are hatched within a few months.
