## The Medical Roundup

### Animal Illness Due to Need for Traces of Certain Elements

As I wrote recently, to a scientist the idea of dividing medical practice into schools or cults seems completely illogical. Such an idea could occur only to a lay person without much medical knowledge. Anyone who has spent his life studying medicine knows that there are any number of causes for disease, not only in man but—and this point is always forgotten by cultists and faith healers—in animals and even plants.

A while ago I was amused when a devout believer in faith healing assured me that if we men and women would only quit fearing disease we would not get it. I said, "It is too bad that you never were on a farm or ranch where hundreds of animals every year get sick and die, and it is too bad that you never heard that some plants get sick and die. Some even suffer from cancer!"

I can remember years ago when a great fruit industry was threatened with ruin because the fruit was becoming speckled with white spots. Desperately, research workers studied the problem, looking for some virus or germ or insect that conceivably could be causing the disease. Finally, a university professor, a friend of mine, discovered that the trouble was a sort of anemia. What the plants needed was a trace of iron, and when they got it, they were well.

May Prove Helpful

An important point that laymen should know is that any bit of information gained by a scientist, working in any one field, may quickly prove to be enormously helpful in another field. For instance, one of the greatest men in American medicine, Dr. Theobald Smith, made his first great discoveries of value to man while trying to find the cause of hog cholera and the Texas fever of cattle.

I was thinking of these things as I read a remarkable article by A. J. Anderson and E. J. Underwood (Sci. Amer., Jan., 1959) on the strange illnesses of sheep and cattle that formerly harassed the ranchers in what used to be a desert in Eastern Australia. There, there are more than 400 million acres in most of which animals could not be raised profitably because they were so sickly. Today, this region is being reclaimed by the addition to the soil of very minute amounts of certain so-called trace-elements or micronutrients. The amounts needed are so small that until new methods of chemical analysis were developed, no one could tell if

these chemicals were present or absent.

These trace elements that plants and animals need in order to live and grow well are iron, manganese, copper, zinc, molybdenum, boron and chlorine. Higher animals, such as man, need the first five in the above list plus two—cobalt and iodine. When I first visited Minnesota in 1917, I saw hundreds of women with goiters, which apparently were due to the absence in Minnesota soils—and hence in Minnesota water and plants—of iodine. Later, when iodine was left in table salt, goiters largely disappeared.

In the Australian desert, the addition of seven pounds per acre of copper sulfate plus seven pounds of zinc sulfate will make the difference between fertility and infertility. In Australia there is a belt of land over 1,000 miles long which is of little value to a rancher until he adds to the soil a trace of molybdenum, and then the land blossoms out with useful plants. When sheep lack copper in their diet their wool is scant and stringy. Lambs may be still-born, or if they are alive when born, they soon die. Cows raised on a land deficient in copper suddenly drop dead! Sheep grown on land that lacks cobalt are sickly, and seem to be starving to death. A single ounce of cobalt or 80 cattle healthy for a year! Curiously, it does not help the sheep to give cobalt by hypodermic injection. It has to be put into the stomach in a sort of cud which stays there for a long time, being slowly absorbed. The

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trace of cobalt enables the intestinal bacteria to make the Vitamin B12 which, in tiny traces, is so essential to life. More Information

There is much more remarkable information in the article on trace elements. I can hear readers saying, "Perhaps I need some of these elements to give me pep." No, the authors say that we humans get our food from so many different sources—beef from one state, pork from another, eggs, potatoes, oranges, tomatoes, wheat and corn from others—that we hardly can suffer from a deficiency. It is different with a domestic animal which has to live out its life on one little plot of ground. But, as man keeps multiplying until, as in India and Egypt, he has trouble growing enough food for a bare subsistence, he will be greatly helped by adding trace chemicals to his land—so that he can get the highest possible yield per acre, and the best type of food for his growing children.
