

Oregon News Briefs

PLANE SEARCH

Salem—UPI—The Rev. W. A. Newsom, Oregon Bishop for the Church of God of Prophecy, today appealed for volunteers to search for a missing plane carrying three brothers which vanished last Friday on a Prineville-to-Salem flight.

Jim Miller, 24, Ashland, was flying the plane to Salem for the church. His twin brothers, Roy and Coy, 14, Turner, also were aboard.

Search has proved unavailing so far. Bishop Newsom said a search party was to look in the Silver Falls area today. A resident of the area heard a plane pass over on the day it was reported missing.

YOUTH HELD

Oregon City—UPI—Duane Marvin Anders, 17, maintained today that the fatal shooting of his father last Sunday night was an accident. The Estacada high school senior class president was held on a first degree murder charge after Sheriff Joe Shobe said the youth admitted setting fire to the family barn after a bullet from a .22 caliber rifle struck Hector Anders, 56.

A grand jury has been called to hear the case.

The youth said the .22 rifle accidentally discharged when he fell from a pile of hay bales. He said he then panicked.

TRIAL HALTED

Portland—UPI—The bribery conspiracy trial of Joseph P. McLaughlin of Seattle came to an abrupt halt Wednesday when the state's principal witnesses, James B. Elkins and Raymond F. Clark, refused to testify.

Elkins and Clark cited constitutional reasons, saying it might affect their pending appeals from a federal wiretap conviction. Circuit Judge James R. Bain dismissed charges against McLaughlin, who was indicted during the 1956 vice probe here.

SONIC BOOM

Oregon City—UPI—A sonic boom caused by jet fighters caused a flurry of excitement here Wednesday night.

A public information officer at the Portland air base said 18 Portland-based F-102s were flying above 30,000 feet, as required, when one or more of the planes broke the sound barrier. At that height, the PIO said, the sound could easily be heard but no damage could result.

Salem—UPI—A measure to place the Oregon State Fair under the Department of Agriculture and abolish the State Fair Commission was aired before the Senate State and Federal Affairs Committee Wednesday. No action was taken on the measure.

Sen. Walter Leth (R-West Salem) said the fair should become a "show window" for the state's economic life.

Salem—UPI—A bill to permit public employees to take part in search and rescue missions for at least five days without loss of pay was passed by the Senate Wednesday and sent to the House.

Salem—UPI—A bill abolishing the Oregon Tunnel Commission was passed by the Senate and sent to the governor Wednesday. The Commission, formed in 1931, long has been inactive.

Salem—UPI—The House Wednesday passed and sent to the Senate a bill to abolish the State Bond Commission.

The Commission is composed of the governor, the state treasurer and an industrial accident commissioner. The measure would make the state treasurer alone responsible for most investment of state funds.

Salem—UPI—The House Education Committee voted 5-4 Wednesday to approve a memorial asking Congress to enact legislation calling for federal aid to education.

Those voting for it were Reps. Wickes Shaw, Al Flegel, John Kerbow, Nancy Kirkpatrick and Wayne Turner, Democrats. Opposed were Fayette Bristol, Evelyn Nye, Stafford Hansell and Shirley Field, Republicans.

INFLATION HITS JAIL

Visalia, Calif.—UPI—Prisoners assigned to road work at Tulare county jail have asked the Board of Supervisors for a 35-cent-a-day increase in their present 15 cent pay. The inmates said they needed the extra pay because prices of personal items like cigarettes and toothpaste have gone up.

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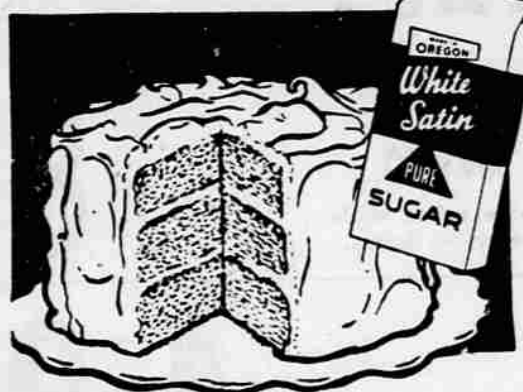
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
