Planners Suggest Approval of Setback Variance Request

The Medford planning commission last night recommended approval for a setback variance request from A. G. Anderson, 401 Park st., to allow erection of an open carport on the lot at that address.

The recommendation followed a public hearing, Allan Perry, vice president of the commission, stated he thought it should be a general policy in the future not to allow such variances unless a case of extreme hardship is involved.

He said he realized the city zoning ordinance permits the granting of variances in extreme cases, but he believed too liberal a policy would hinder the effectiveness of the ordinance.

Also recommended for approval was the request for a change of zone from single family to light industrial for the property bounded by North Riverside ave., Court st. and Ohio st.

The planners approved a request for the vacation of Mingus st. This matter will be given a public hearing before the city council, City Manager Robert A. Duff pointed out that Mingus, while dedicated, has never been used for utilities or otherwise improved. It is southwest of the intersection of Summit ave. and McAndrews rd.

The commission continued its March meeting a public hearing on the proposed municipal subdivision ordinance. Three other hearings also were continued. These include zone change requests for the Luther and Ann Davis property on Barnett rd. near the proposed freeway interchange, the Eagles' property on Biddle rd., and the E. W. Brown property on Crater Lake ave. east of the Jackson st. shopping center.

The planners continued consideration of a request to vacate an alley in the Riverside subdivision north of Manhattan st.

A request for vacation of an alley north of O'Gara ave. between South Holly and South Grape sts. was turned down, on grounds it may provide an access for a proposed couplet and serve abutting commercial lots.

The requests of William Aulick and Carl Wilke for annexation to the city of property southeast of the Stewart ave.—Peach st. intersection were denied. Aulick said the requests were made in hope of obtaining city sewer service.

He said sanitation conditions in that area are poor, and some people are letting their private sewers run into the ditch that borders Stewart ave.

Create Other Problems
Perry stated that annexation of property south of Stewart ave. would create "other problems," especially with respect to the present city-county arrangement for maintenance of streets such as Stewart running along the city limits.

Public hearings were called for the next regular meeting on two zone change requests. The first is for a change from multiple family to commercial for property at the northeast corner of Western ave. and West Main st. The second, from J. L. Cook, is for property between East Main st. and Reddy ave. west of Lindley ave., and asks a change from single family residential to multiple family.

The planners also called for a public hearing on a request for a setback variance for a Richfield service station at East Jackson st. and Lindley ave.

A request for a sign variance at 246 South Ivy st. was denied.

Approve Plat
The commission approved Roy P. Wilkes' final plat for his Brookhurst subdivision unit No. 2, and studied a proposed subdivision for alter Wood in the Grandview area. Duff suggested the possibility of the city's assisting subdividers of small tracts in preparing their plats and plans.

Consideration of changing to commercial the zoning for the currently non-conforming B. & G. business property on East Jackson st. west of Genesee st. was deferred.

President Selby announced that in the future the deadline for placing items on the commissions agenda will be the Friday evening preceding the week of the regular meeting.
