Jacksonville high bowled over the leader and Butte Falls the cellarite Friday night to maintain their deadlock in second place in Jackson County B league basketball.

The Redskins of Jacksonville laced St. Mary's of Medford 70 to 52 and Butte Falls dropped Prospect 55 to 44.

Firing at a torrid 460 clip from the field, the Jacksonville club, nevertheless, accumulated a big share of its difference from the free line where it made 24 points to 14 by the Crusaders. From the field the 'Skins shot 23 for 50 and St. Mary's put in 20 of 55 for 363. Twenty-nine fouls were tacked on the Medford five and 17 on Jacksonville.

The Redskins had period gaps of 12 to 7, 30 to 16 and 53 to 34. Ken Perreard and Henry Vessel each had 14 points for Jacksonville and Gary Miksche 13 and Bob Evans and Ron Daley each 12 for SM.

Perreard and Doyle Branson, Jacksonville, and Miksche. St. Mary's lost Dick Evans, Ron Daley and Roger Hout on fouls in the fourth quarter.

The Loggers showed improvement over recent games with their 359 field shooting. Floyd Scatfe was Prospect high scorer with 15. For BF Edwin Ellis shot 15 and Raymond Abbott got 13 points and 19 rebounds.

Jacksonville won its jayvee game 50 to 41 with Gale Shepherd shooting 13. Mike Austin had 18 for SM. Darrell Hawkins scored 10 as Butte Falls JV won 31 to 22.

Bug Brush Sets Mark For Fillys

Arcaia, Calif. —(UP)— Bug Brush, the only filly in the race, set a new world's record for a mile and an eighth as she captured the \$58,100 San Antonio handicap from Hillsdale at Santa Anita by nearly a length Saturday.

The four-year-old filly raced the distance in 1:46 2-5 to clip two-fifths of a second off the world's record. She was the first filly ever to win the rich race although a half-dozen had attempted it over the years.

It was a brilliant and hard-fought race between Bug Brush and Hillsdale down the stretch but in the final 50 yards the filly pulled ahead to score her game victory under the excellent ride of Angel Valenzuela.

The big Saturday crowd of more than 49,000 racing fans gave the C. V. Whitney filly a big hand when it was announced that she had set a new world's record.

Originally the old record was set by Noor and equalled by four other horses including Round Table in winning the San Antonio last year. But Round Table passed up Saturday's race because of a 135 pound impost.

Tennesean Leads Open At Tucson

Tucson, Ariz. —(UP)— Joe Campbell of Knoxville, Tenn., took a firm three-stroke lead after 54 holes of the \$15,000 Tucson Open golf tournament Saturday with a five under par 65.

That gave the burly Campbell a three-round total of 194. Campbell's first two rounds were 65 and 64.

PGA Field Secretary Jim Gaquin said Campbell's tally is the low for three rounds in the last three years of PGA competition in the country.

The record of 189 was set in the 1954 Texas Open.

Art Wall Jr., the circuit's current money leader from Pecon Manor, Pa., took second place with a three-under par 67 Saturday.

Julius Boros of Mid Pines, N. C., co-leader Friday with Campbell at the halfway mark, shot par 70 cold today on the 35-35 layout. It was good enough for third place at 199.

Three golfers were tied at 200. They were Gene Littler of San Diego, Walt Burkemo of Franklin Hills, Mich., and Henry Williams Jr. of Fleetwood, Pa. Williams Saturday had a 66, Burkemo a 67 and Littler a 68.

Campbell had six birdies, including a one on the par-five 18th hole.

He said his driving — just as in the first two rounds — put him in good position all day. Campbell said he did not know if he felt he held a good enough lead to not feel pressure today.

Said the former NCAA golf king from Purdue:

"You don't know until you play. It was the lowest three rounds he put together since turning pro after last year's Masters tournament."

Giants Sell Lockman
San Francisco —(UP)— The San Francisco Giants broke another link with the past Saturday when they sold Whitey Lockman, their oldest player in point of service, to the Baltimore Orioles for an undisclosed sum.

Club secretary Eddie Brannick announced the deal and said, "we're sure that Baltimore will benefit from getting him."

Lee MacPhail, Baltimore's general manager, said that Lockman's acquisition "should answer our need for another first baseman of proven major league ability to back up Boyd."

The blond veteran completed his 14th season with the transplanted New Yorkers last year when he batted .238 as a pinch-hitter and utility player. He had come to terms with San Francisco for the 1959 season.

Whitey, 32, came to the Giants in 1945 from their Jersey City farm club and smashed a home run his first time at bat as a major leaguer. That launched an era with the team which saw him splitting his duties between first base and the outfield in the early years.

Frankie Ryff Takes Tussle

New York —(UP)—Lightweight Frankie Ryff, well-known winner over Cisco Andrade, considered offers of other fights on the comeback trail today at Madison Square Garden and at Portland, Ore.

The rangy New York blond was bleeding from five places Friday night when he won an upset unanimous decision at the Garden over Andrade of Compton, Calif.; but he said today none of the wounds were serious enough to keep him out of action more than three weeks.

Ryff was lucky in his Friday-the-13th fight with Andrade. He concentrated on long-range tactics against his shorter, harder-hitting opponent and thereby avoided getting sliced so deeply that the TV bout could have been stopped.

At the finish, Ryff—an underdog at 13-10—was bleeding from the nose and from cuts on both brows, on the right cheek and inside his upper lip.

Berkeley, Calif. —(UP)— California increased its Pacific Coast Conference basketball lead to a full game Friday night by smothering Oregon 83-55 in a one-sided contest.

The Bears jumped off to a 15-1 lead before Stu Robertson made the first field goal for the Ducks after nine minutes and 20 seconds of the game were gone.

The Bears, standing 7-2 in conference play, had an easy time against the team that gave them one of their losses. They dominated both backboards and defended the Ducks out of the game early.

At halftime Cal led by a 38-17 count and the game was no contest at any time. Darrell Imhoff, Cal's six-foot-ten-inch center, led the scoring with 24 points, mostly on close-in shots. Denny Strickland was high for Oregon with 12.

California hit on 47 per cent of its floor shots to 35 per cent for Oregon.

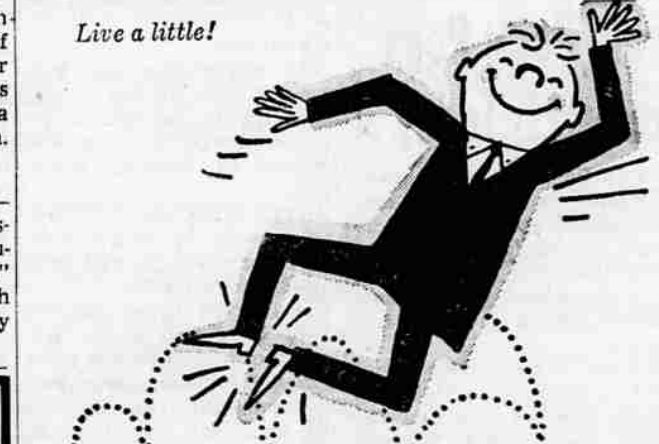
