Pollen May Carry Cherry Tree Disease

Geneva, N.Y. — (Science Service) — Necrotic ring spot of sour cherries may be carried from diseased trees to healthy ones by pollen, Cornell University scientists at the New York State Agricultural Experiment Station here have found. This means seeds from which new cherry trees might be grown can carry the virus infection. Pollen transmission of the virus may be an explanation for the sudden rapid spread of the disease in apparently virus-free orchards five to eight years after planting, the scientists said.
