

Truman Article Due Wednesday

"I hope the visit of Prime Minister Macmillan to the Kremlin results in the opening of a door," writes former President Harry S. Truman.

He cites reasons for hope in the face of past diplomatic discouragements in dealing with the Soviets. And the man who has bargained with the Russians many times ex-

plains why he believes a Russian trip by President Eisenhower or Vice President Nixon would be unwise.

His reasons for belief in the Macmillan journey and disbelief in an American equivalent will prove provocative to thinking people everywhere, in a timely article of international importance appearing in the Mail Tribune Wednesday.

Watching for Glaucoma

I recently read an article sent out by the National Society for the Prevention of Glaucoma. The author says, glaucoma is a major cause of blindness in the United States. What is said is that many people with fuzzy vision or pain in their eyes, or seeing colored halos around lights, without going to an ophthalmologist to see what is wrong. Sometimes, by the time they go, it is too late.

In cases of glaucoma it is easier for fluid to get into the eye than to get out, and as a result the tension within the eyeball increases. This in turn interferes with the circulation of the retina (seeing membrane at the back of the eye) that the people lose their sight. This article tells of a series of 7,943 patients, most of whom had gone to eye specialists. When examined, 2.01 per cent were found to have glaucoma, and another small group had changes which suggested a beginning glaucoma.

Fortunately, much can be done for the patient with glaucoma. Often, putting drops in the eye every day will save the person's sight. Sometimes a little operation is performed in which a tiny

window is made between two parts of the eye.

A Shop for Epileptics

One of the fine things being done in this country for handicapped people is the development of so-called Epil-Hab shops where epileptics can be given a job with a pay check. I was just reading about the success of these shops in the magazine "Performance," which is published by the President's Committee on Employment of the Physically Handicapped, in Washington 25, D. C. These shops were originally created by the Veterans' Administration in Los Angeles, California, and the idea is now spreading to Phoenix, Arizona and Jamaica, Long Island.

According to the writer in "Performance," these shops soon pay for themselves because when a man works all day for good wages he no longer has to be supported by the community. He is immensely happier because he is self-supporting, and the community also can be happier.

There is great need in every city for more shops of this type; some for epileptics, some for persons discharged from a mental hospital; some for men discharged from a prison, and many for elderly men and women. It is remarkable that cities everywhere are not organizing these shops because in so doing they could quickly lift a big load off the shoulders of the taxpayers.

This person told someone else and soon everyone along the route was checking on the time schedule. Pride always arrived promptly at 3:25, rain or shine. People began to realize the 3:25 arrival was neither accidental or coincidental. It was well planned, well timed. People began checking

their watches by the dog's passing.

Once someone called on William's mother, to see if she dispatched Pride every afternoon. She hardly noticed but she became interested and found that each day, about 3:20 Pride trotted away and disappeared down the street.

Month after month passed, and Pride continued his schedule and people took it for granted. Then one afternoon a merchant, whose store was close to the bus stop, looked out the front window and called his wife, "Look," he said, "Pride has become fouled up for the first time. He's out there now waiting and it's already a quarter of four. He's missed the bus by a mile."

His wife looked out the window at the dog, then at her wrist watch, listened to it tick for a minute or so then laughed. "Pride is on schedule, just the same as always, your watch is 20 minutes fast." It was.
