House Memorial Urges Congress To Grant Education Aid

Salem - (UPI) - The Oregon House Monday passed a memorial urging Congress to grant federal aid to education after one of the hottest debates so far this session.

Vote on the measure was 33 to 25 with all but one Democrat voting for the memorial and all but two Republicans opposing it. Two members were absent.

The memorial urges both federal aid for construction purpose and teacher salaries.

Rep. Al Giegel (D-Roseburg) carried the bill on the floor, saying that \$4 million was now supplied to Oregon under federal programs to promote research.

'Strings' Cited
Rep. Stafford Hansell (R-Athens) opposed the bill on grounds federal aid would be offered only with "strings" attached and that there would be trouble trying to figure out how to distribute the money.

Rep. Keith Skelton (D-Eugene) pointed out that no state would be required to take the federal money if Congress voted it. He said the money from the federal government would not imply federal control.

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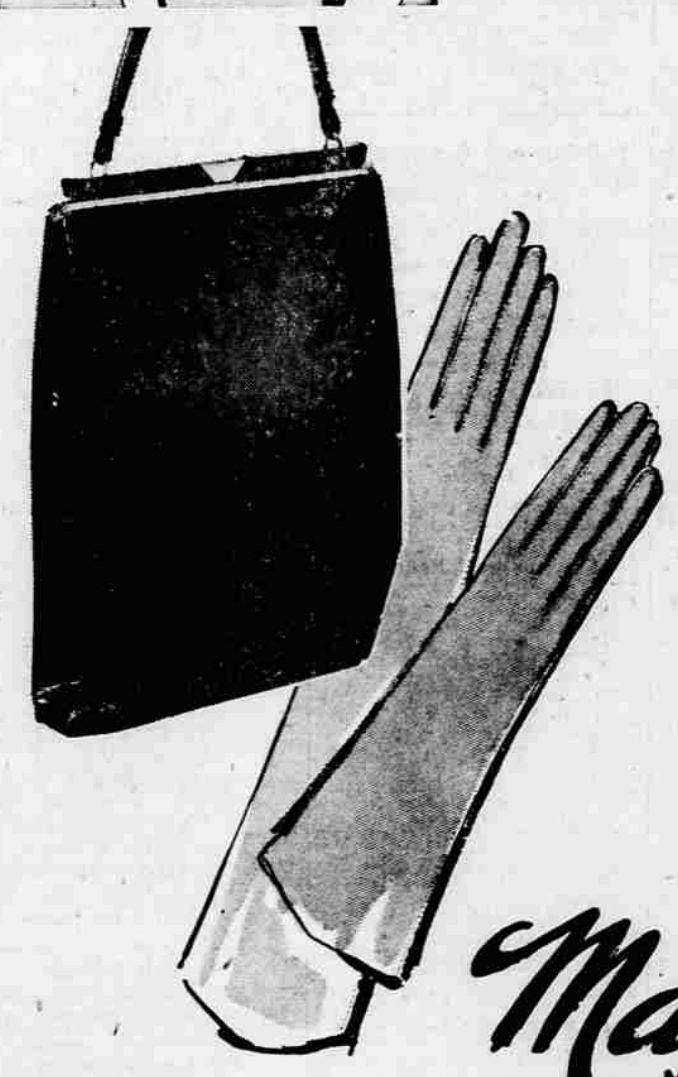

Washington - (UPI) - Government officials have unveiled new tax regulations on the Christmas turkeys to mollify a senator who had given them the bird.

Sen. John J. Williams, (R-Del.), made public correspondence with Dana Latham, commissioner of internal revenue. It outlined the senator's inquiry about the tax status of turkeys given by an employer to his employee at Christmas time.

It includes the good news that a ruling, to be formally issued soon, decrees that a

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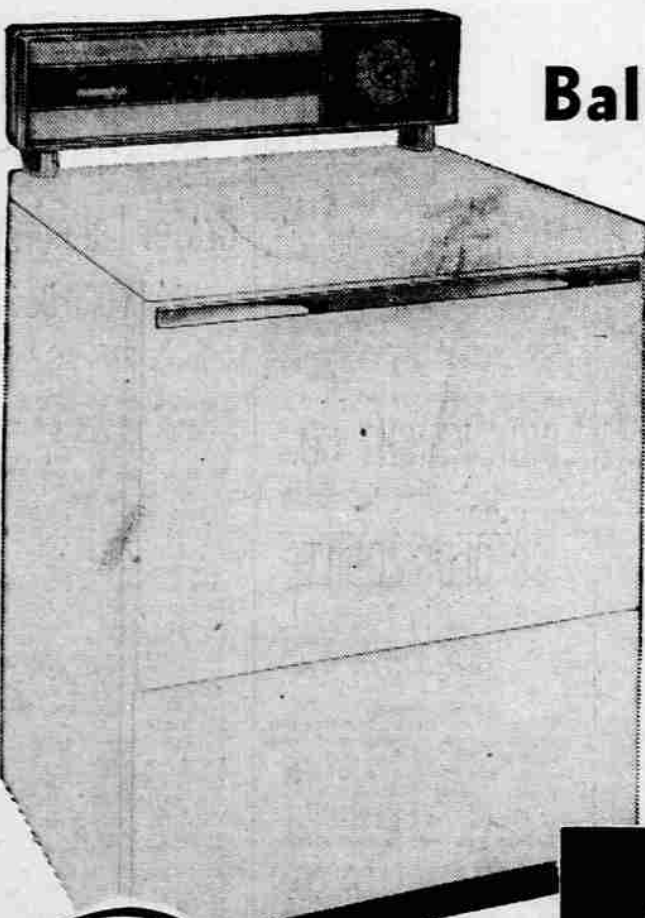
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
