Senate To Get Weekly Reports On Appropriations

Salem—UPI—Weekly reports to the state Senate of total appropriations made from the state's general fund will be made hereafter, Sen. Alfred Corbett (D-Portland), co-chairman of the Joint Ways and Means Committee, announced Tuesday.

Corbett's statement followed a request by Sen. John D. Hare (R-Hillsboro) for such a report, saying that members could keep closer track of the progress of the Ways and Means Committee.

It was Hare who on Monday unsuccessfully attempted to have the Senate adopt a policy of not considering any appropriation bills until after the Senate had passed all tax bills. This motion was defeated by an overwhelming vote.

Responsibility Bill
The bill requiring all automobile owners to provide evidence of financial responsibility before being licensed to operate their cars on the state's highways was read for the first time.

This bill specified that car owners must either show a certificate of liability and insurance, post a financial responsibility bond or a certificate of self insurance.

The amounts proposed in the bill are \$10,000 liability insurance for the injury or death of one person, \$20,000 for injury or death of two persons but limited to \$10,000 for each person, and \$5,000 for property damage. One feature of the bill calls upon the state insurance commissioner to make up a schedule of rates for liability insurance which will distinguish between safe drivers and those who have been involved in accidents.

Some 'Health Foods' Sold to Americans Have Odd Origins

Editor's note: This is the final dispatch on phony food and drug claims and what's being done to stop the racket.

Washington—UPI—Some of the "health foods" sold to Americans have strange origins.

A few weeks ago, the U.S. Food & Drug Administration lowered the boom on a West Coast firm that was selling candy treated with pollen as a "wonder food" to repair worn-out tissues, relieve coughs and hay fever, and help you get a good night's sleep.

The price: \$9.95 for a box containing 16 small pieces of candy.

The FDA said pollen is fine food for bees, but has "no practical value for human nutrition."

Bees seem to fascinate food faddists. A perennial best-seller, which has survived repeated FDA investigations, is royal jelly.

World Warming Trends Confirmed In Antarctica

Washington—(Science Service)—Temperature data obtained in Antarctica during the International Geophysical Year seem to confirm the world's long-term warming trend.

Extensive temperature records were collected on the "white" continent during 1957 and 1958 by U.S. Weather Bureau meteorologists and weathermen from other countries. These records are consistent with the theory that the entire world is slowly getting warmer.

Dr. H. E. Landsberg of the Bureau's office of climatology has found.

Glaciers Retreating
Concerning the north polar regions, he said, physical evidence and temperature trends both indicate warming. Glaciers are retreating in Alaska and the harbor of Spitsbergen is open twice as long each year as in 1912, for example.

Dr. Landsberg said the warming trend, thought to amount to some two or three degrees each century, started about 1900. Cause of the warming is unknown, but one theory is that a blanket of carbon dioxide given off by the burning of coal and oil retards radiation of heat by the earth. Another suggested explanation is an increase in the sun's radiation.

Turkish Premier Escapes Plane Crash

London—UPI—A Viscount airliner carrying Turkish Premier Adnan Menderes to the Cyprus peace conference here crashed-landed in a slight fog five miles from Gatwick Airport south of London Tuesday.

Menderes escaped without serious injury, and was taken to London for treatment after receiving first aid near the scene.

Three hours after the accident, the British Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation indicated 10 persons were killed and 10 were injured.
