Black Tornado varsity meets Grants Pass in conference contention on Saturday. A jayvee game at 6:30 p.m. will precede the 8:15 p.m. main game at Hedrick. Sophomore clubs mix at 6:30 p.m. at the senior high school.

Victories over Ashland and Grants Pass are just about musts for Medford Tornado varsity to keep in the chase for the loop diadem. The second place Tornadoes particularly will be aiming at Grants Pass which is just a half-game behind in third place but Ashland is still an obstacle in the title quest.

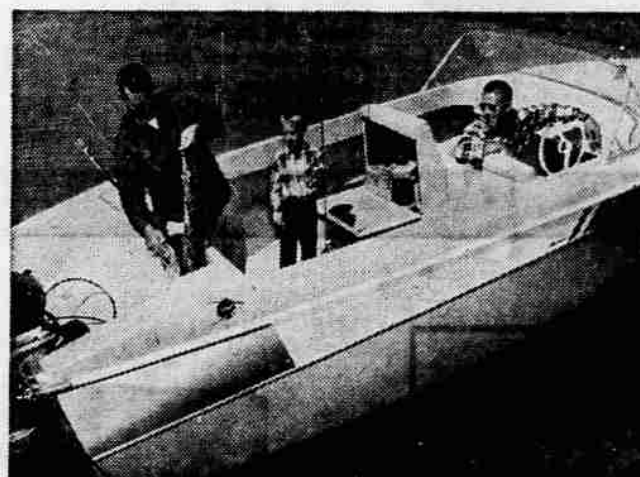
