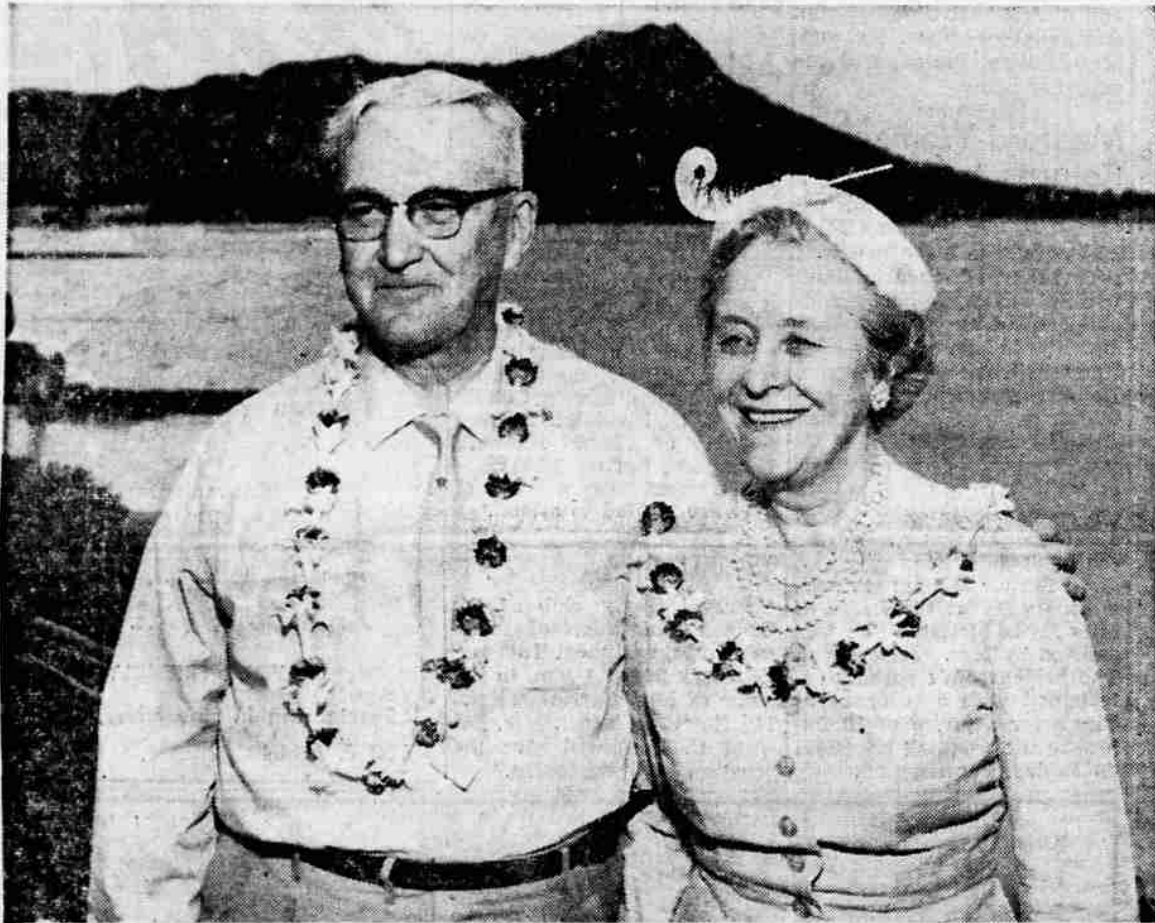


February Events
