The newlyweds traveled to Southern California where the bridegroom is stationed aboard the USS Uhlmann. He is a torpedoman's mate third class in the United States navy.

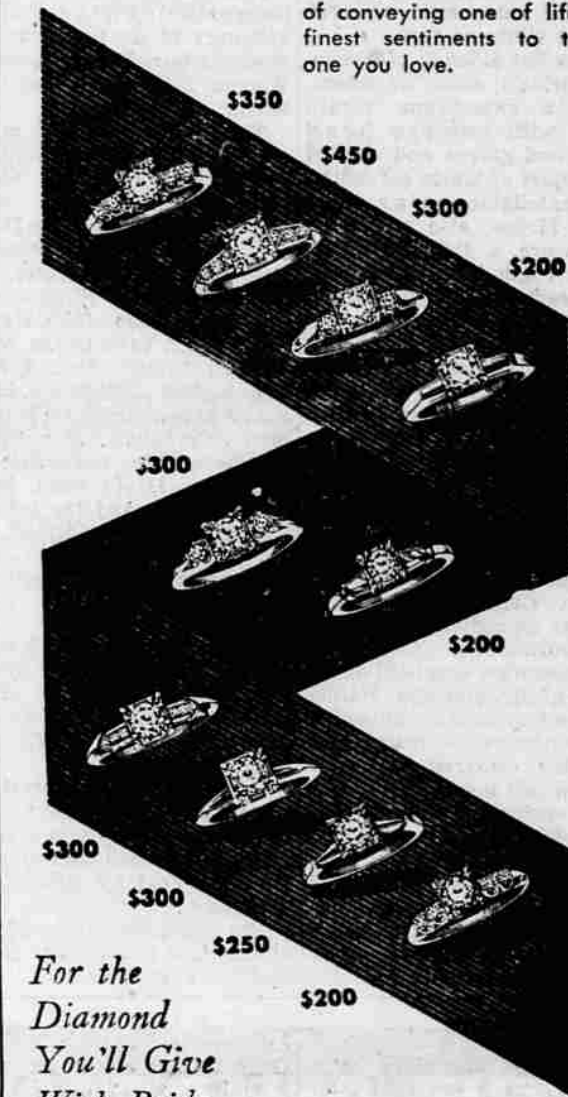
