

U.S. Ski Team Rated High For Winter Games

Squaw Valley, Calif. —(UPI)—Off the basis of showings in the North American championships against top competition from Europe, all-around champion Bud Werner predicted today that the United States would do "very well" in the Alpine events of the 1960 Olympic Winter games.

Werner was speaking with authority because he had just whipped some of the finest skiers in the world. The skier from Steamboat Springs, Colo., won the downhill, slalom and combined

titles in three days of competition on the slopes that will host the 1960 Olympic Games. And, he finished second in the giant slalom.

Faced Top Skiers
Competing against him, aside from top skiers in this country, were the stars from Austria, Norway, Chile and Japan.

Monday's downhill activities ended the Alpine part of the North American Championships and on Saturday starts the Nordic competition here. The National Invitational Skating competition opens

Squaw Valley Site Praised
Squaw Valley, Calif. —(UPI)—John J. Garland, U.S. delegate to the International Olympic committee, today hailed the Squaw Valley site for the 1960 Winter Olympics as "a new departure."

He predicted that the group will be "very pleased" in a report he will make to it in May in Munich.

Squaw Valley was praised by Garland because it has all the Olympic facilities in one area except for cross-country events.

Garland noted that at the 1952 Olympics in Oslo spectators traveled 75 miles to see the giant slalom. At Cortina in 1956, they twisted 25 miles over a torturous road to see speed skating, he said.
