Western Hemisphere relations:

A joint committee of Americans and Canadians, which has been studying American surplus wheat disposal programs, has just issued a report agreeing that American dumping of subsidized surplus wheat has definitely hurt Canada and will continue to do so.

Who wrote the report?  
You'll be surprised.

It was written by W. E. Hamilton, research director of the American Farm Bureau Federation, and W. M. Drummond, a member of Canada's royal commission on price spreads of food products—both of whom represent AGRICULTURAL interests.

**HOW is Canada hurt?**  
By paying high price subsidies, we promote overproduction of wheat in the United States. When our storage facilities begin to bulge, we start dumping our surplus abroad. Some of it we sell at low prices. Some of it we give away.

Naturally enough, that hurts the Canadians, who have wheat to sell.

**SO MUCH** for our Canadian neighbors and their wheat troubles. Let's take a look at our Mexican neighbors and their cotton troubles. We subsidize overproduction of cotton, as well as wheat.

And—  
We dump our surplus cotton abroad at bargain prices. That doesn't please our Mexican neighbors—who have cotton to sell.

If you read the papers carefully, you must have noted that this cotton dumping business was discussed at considerable length the other day by President Eisenhower and Mexican President Mateos at their meeting in Acapulco the other day. President Mateos made it plain he isn't too happy about it.

**HOW** about American farmers

**IN WASHINGTON** the other day, Sen. John J. Williams of Delaware—who, you will remember was a hay and feed dealer before he became a senator—cited statistics showing, he said, that under the government's price support program MAJOR BENEFITS have gone to very large corporate farm operators.

He said that in 1957 the federal government paid \$3,400,000 in price supports to THREE big farm operators in Arkansas, Mississippi and California.

**WHY** do we do all this?  
The political farmers, who farm the farmers for votes instead of farming the soil for crops, continue to believe that a LOT OF VOTES can be garnered in election years by subsidizing agriculture.

That's about the long and short of it.

**AH, ME!**  
If, in our great country, we did only the things that are GOOD STATESMANSHIP instead of doing so many things that are regarded by the politicians as GOOD POLITICS, how wonderful it would be!

**FBI Studies Report Of Contest Fraud**

Portland — The FBI was reported today to have entered the investigation into a ring which supplied answers to newspapers' cash-paying crossword contests.

Both the Oregon Journal and the Oregonian have announced discontinuance of the puzzles after saying they were victimized by the tipsters.

The Journal quoted a spokesman for the FBI as saying "no further comment" on the matter would be forthcoming until the probe is completed. The Oregonian, meanwhile, quoted a man whom it said had turned down a chance to win part of a prize and had cooperated with the newspaper, as saying he had received threatening telephone calls.
