

Union Spending Study Urged on Senate Probers

Washington—(UPI)—The Senate Rackets Committee is being jugged by its Republican members to investigate union political spending, particularly in campaigns against right-to-work proposals.

The matter was discussed at a closed session Wednesday after the committee wound up a public hearing on Chicago juke box racketeering.

Chairman John L. McClellan (D-Ark.) said no formal motions were offered and no decisions were made by the committee.

However, Sen. Barry Goldwater (R-Ariz.) said he had received a request that the committee inquire into the campaign made against the right-to-work proposal in Ohio last fall. The proposal was overwhelmingly defeated in the November election.

Alleges Reprisal Threats

Goldwater said he had received allegations indicating that some signers of the right-to-work petition were threatened with reprisals for their stand.

It was understood that Goldwater brought up the subject at Wednesday's meeting but did not press it. Sen. Karl E. Mundt (R-S.D.), told newsmen he was certain the group would go into this field this year.

Organized labor waged an all-out campaign against right-to-work proposals in several states last year. Some states already have such laws, which ban union shop contracts making union membership a condition of employment.

Titan Flight Called Success

Cape Canaveral, Fla.—(UPI)—The Titan, fledgling member of this country's arsenal of intercontinental ballistic missiles, apparently had another success to its credit today.

The Air Force sent one of the sleek rockets aloft Wednesday under limited power and over a short range. "Everything looks real good," a project official commented after early data was in.

The Titan, lighter and more powerful than the Atlas ICBM, is designed to carry a hydrogen warhead more than 8,000 miles.

In Wednesday's test the 110-ton test vehicle traveled about 300 statute miles under the propulsion of a single booster engine, believed to be the most powerful single thrust unit in the free world.

A dummy second stage, filled with about 5,000 gallons of water for ballast, was not separated.

This was the second successful Titan firing in as many attempts, although malfunctions have caused "scrubbing" of other test shots before the Titan left its pad.

The Martin Co., builder of the Titan, believes the weapon can be made combat-ready within a year.

Weyerhaeuser, IWW Meet Set

Portland—(UPI)—Federal Mediator Leroy Smith said today he has scheduled a meeting here between the International Woodworkers of America and the Weyerhaeuser Timber Co. for Monday at 1:30 p.m.

The meeting will be held to discuss a labor dispute arising from firing of a truck driver at the Coos Bay operations of the firm.

Pickets have halted company operations at North Bend, Ore., and earlier this month roving pickets shut down Weyerhaeuser operations briefly at other points in Oregon and Washington as a result of the dispute.

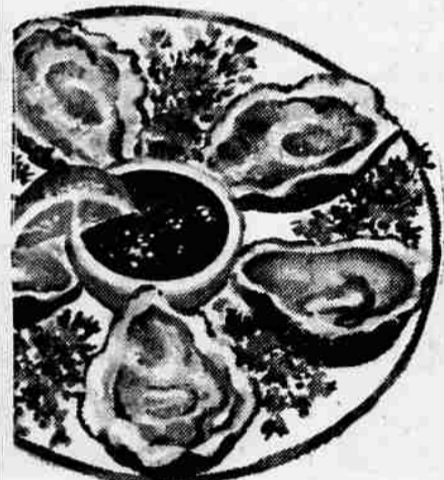
