Stocks Irregular After Industrials Reach Record High

New York—(UPI)—Stocks turned irregular today after the industrial average had pushed on to a new record high.

Trading, active while prices were in an advance, tightened on the subsequent setback from the highs.

Most of the industrial favorites held in a narrow range. American Telephone rose to a new high since 1930 on a gain of more than a point. DuPont and Eastman retreated by more than a point each.

The wide movers centered on specialties. General Tire, Stauffer Chemical, Thiokol, and Polaroid were the features. Stauffer at its best was up 12 points. Republic Aviation fell four points on a cut dividend. Zenith lost three. Ampex was down two.

Elsewhere prices retreated from their highs.

Army Jupiter Firing Succeeds

Cape Canaveral, Fla.—(UPI)—The Army successfully fired another workhorse Jupiter on a routine test flight early today and then turned its attention to the new moon rocket it has assembled 150 yards away.

The Jupiter's flight of less than its full 1,700-mile range set the stage for blastoff of the Army's second space probe, expected some time this week end. The Jupiter will again be used as the Army moon rocket booster.

If the new Army moon rocket functions perfectly, it will hurl the spinning payload the 221,000 miles to the edge of the moon in about 34 hours. It then will hurl on, free of both the earth and the moon's gravity, to join Lunik as another satellite of the sun.

Fires, Rioting at Malta Naval Yard

Valletta, Malta—(UPI)—Rioting and fires broke out at the British Navy dockyard here today when 6,000 Maltese dockworkers received notice that a private British firm is taking over the yard.

Police used tear gas against the rioters.

Flames could be seen from the center of the city across the bay from the dockyard.

The superintendent of the yard, Adm. J. Lee Bargerber, was struck with several stones before he gained the shelter of an office.

The rioters set several cars afire, including one belonging to a British Naval officer.

Half Inch of Snow on Ground at Meacham

Salem—(UPI)—It was snowing hard at Meacham with half an inch of new snow on the ground at 8:30 a.m. today. There was packed snow at Willamette pass and Ochoco summit. Otherwise most pavements were reported bare except for icy spots at Warm Springs Junction.

Surplus Power Meeting Scheduled

Salem—(UPI)—Gov. Mark Hatfield said today a meeting would be held here March 4 among representatives from Oregon, Washington and California to consider problems connected with delivery of surplus power to California from Bonneville Power administration.

Hatfield said Gov. Edmund G. Brown of California and Gov. Albert Rosellini of Washington had agreed to the meeting.

The meeting will be an outgrowth of a California suggestion that surplus power in the north be sent to that state by an intertie of power lines.
