'Diary' Among More Serious Productions Tried by HS Cast

One of the most serious and interesting plays ever attempted by a Medford High school cast had its first performance last night at the school auditorium. "The Diary of Anne Frank" is a many-scened dramatic adaptation of the day-by-day account of how eight Jews, three young people and five adults, hid for 25 months in the attic of an Amsterdam warehouse in an effort to escape Nazi persecution. This play is not fiction from the brain of some playwright; it has the impact of real life.

The story is grim and terrible, yet the play is not without humor. Though these eight individuals never left the attic, day or night, spoke only in whispers and moved around as little as possible during the hours the workmen were on duty in the warehouse below, they managed somehow to maintain some semblance of normal life.

There are those incidents, too, which though they border on tragedy bring laughter from the audience.

Assembles Good Cast

Director Lenore Zapell assembled a good cast for this difficult production. Susanne Moore gives a sensitive and moving portrayal of Anne, the intelligent, warm-hearted and spirited young teenager who wrote the diary now considered a literary masterpiece.

This reviewer finds it difficult to assess the dramatic efforts of young amateurs attempting a play of this caliber. For a time last night one wondered if such youthful players could manage this play, but they did.

Council, Planners Discuss Variance, Rezoning Requests

The Medford city council and planning commission last night discussed two zone changes and a setback variance request at a joint meeting. The meeting was called after the council last week questioned three recommendations from the planning commission.

With respect to a recommended zone change from residential to limited commercial for Gottleib Wolff's property at the southeast corner of Crater Lake ave. and Roberts rd., the council noted that a 258-signature petition had been filed in opposition.

City Manager Robert A. Duff said last night he had just received petitions from about 20 persons who had signed the original petition and now wished to support the zone change instead.

Suggests Reason

Duff suggested that one reason so many had signed originally was that some had not understood either what might result from the change or what the planners had in mind in recommending the change be approved.

"If we did have some education in this area we would get some support," Duff said.

Anderson had observed earlier in the evening that he thought part of the opposition to this zone change stemmed from distrust of what it might lead to in the way of future developments. Mayor John W. Snider pointed out that while the change might be inevitable the question right now is whether this is the proper time for it. The council is slated to consider the matter further at a public hearing March 19.

Requested Zone Change

The second recommendation questioned by the council is the requested zone change from residential to limited commercial for property at the northeast corner of East Jackson and Genesee sts., the proposed site for a branch of the Rogue Valley State Bank. The council held a public meeting hearing on this last week.

Councilman Ed Hall, Ward I, reported that property owners on the south side of Jackson between Genesee and Stark st. support this change since they plan to request a change for their own property next. He said he wondered if this was the time to permit the change in view of protests from other residents in the area.

The possibility of requiring owners of property rezoned to commercial to provide a "buffer strip" between their property and adjacent residential property was discussed. This strip could take the form of landscaping, with the commercial structure set back a considerable distance from the property line.

Eastern Oregon Grazing Curbed

Portland—(UPI)—The Bureau of Land Management said today it has ordered grazing reductions in two eastern Oregon areas to prevent further deterioration of lands.

Virgil T. Heath, state BLM supervisor, said reductions were ordered for about 50 per cent of current licensed use on the Cow Creek unit of Malheur county and for 58 per cent on the Snake River-Sisley Creek allotment of Baker county.

However, BLM said appeals were expected and that cuts would be postponed pending final adjudication.

The range use reductions were ordered by district BLM Managers Derrel Fulwider of Vale and Euel Davis of Baker, L. C. (Jack) Binford, state Izaak Walton league leader, has charged that BLM officials in Washington, D.C. did not accept recommendations of the field staff regarding grazing reductions to restore deteriorating ranges.

Jack Edson, planning commission member, said he thought refusing a variance could set an example to discourage other contractors from taking liberties. But, he added, he knew the persons involved in this particular instance and was sure they had not acted in bad faith.

The purpose of last night's meeting was solely for discussion to clarify issues and resolve differences if possible between the two groups. No formal action was taken in the matters discussed.

Father Brings Arrest of Sons

Oakland—(UPI)—Richard Paulsich, 41, explained Thursday he had his three teen-age sons arrested because he wanted to do something "to straighten them out before there is serious trouble."

He said the boys—Richard Jr., 16; John, 15, and William, 13—stomped him in his backyard, kicked the fog lights out of his car, scratched the paint, and brought their friends home to play dice and drink liquor.

"It's a rat pack," Paulsich said. "I want to do something to straighten them out before there is serious trouble. They could be good boys and good citizens—but not if they keep on with their duck-tail haircuts and keep on mingling with rats who have no respect for any one they can intimidate."

Paulsich filed a complaint against the youths on the technical charge they were "incorrigible."

Officers who took the teenagers into custody said Paulsich's sons threatened to "get even" with their father when they are released.
