You and Your Pet

If you pick up a starving dog, and make him prosperous, he will not bite you. This is the principle difference between a dog and a man.

We seek your cooperation in ridding our streets, highways and alleyways of abandoned or stray small animals. The solution of this problem is as easy as ABC - "Animal Birth Control."

Pet owners should adopt and carry out a sensible program of animal birth control. By this is meant humane neutering by professional veterinarians of all pets.

If you have a dog or cat and can no longer take care of it, or just don't want it around, don't just give it away to the first person, who will take it off your hands. Call the Humane society's office, NO 4-2406, and we will endeavor to find a good home.

We must learn to sympathize with the animals about us. We must realize that they

love life just as we love it, that they suffer just as we suffer, that they are hurt by harshness and threats as we are hurt by them, that they are influenced by our thoughts as we are influenced by the thoughts of one another, that they love kindly treatment as you and I.

A clipping taken from the Los Angeles Times in which Jack Smith was writing under the byline "Smith and Men," stated there are people who like cats and will defend them beyond reason, that these people are psychologically sick.

If attachment to these creatures of nature, or if laboring in their behalf, represents, according to Jack Smith, a neurotic personality, then I for one along with President Roosevelt, Gen. The last I heard, the "toy terrier" had grown to full Dane dimensions, and was lording it over his doting owners, who had bought a country home with five acres of fenced-in land for him.
