

At Least Two Die as Flames Sweep Hotel

Hazelton, Pa. — (UPI) — A fire roared through the 100-room Gary Hotel early today, killing at least two persons and trapping some of the estimated 50 occupants on the upper floors of the five-story building.

Seventeen persons were injured, two of them critically, in the fire.

Firemen probed through the charred ruins of the fourth and fifth floor where some of the residents of the hotel and apartment building were believed to have been trapped.

Dead Identified
The dead were identified as Mrs. Howard Deitch, about 50, and Miss Mary Mooney, about 65.

Admitted to State hospital in critical condition were Mrs. Deitch's husband, Howard, 53, and John Dougherty, age unavailable. Also admitted to the same hospital were George Radez, 66, Elmira, N.Y., and John Goodman, age unavailable, Staten Island, N.Y.

Crawled Through Window
David Jacobson, 27, Philadelphia, was in a third floor room when the fire struck but crawled through a window and was led down by an aerial ladder to safety.

Some occupants of the lower floors escaped by leaping from their windows.

The blaze broke out shortly after 1 a.m. in an elevator shaft and mushroomed up through the lower floors.

Biggest Candle Poses Problem For Engineers

Portland — (UPI) — What may be the biggest candle in the world has drawn frustrated sighs from engineers and scientists who are trying to figure out a way to build the wax giant and burn it in the Garden of Tomorrow for Oregon's Centennial celebration.

Engineers on the technical board of Engineering Marketing Associates, Inc., have adopted the candle project as a public service.

Wax Donated
The candle will be made from wax donated by private citizens over the past few months. It will weigh in excess of seven tons, and engineers have been trying to figure out a way to support the candle and also have the candle support its own weight. It will be about 35 feet high and be reinforced with steel arms branching out from a steel pipe which will carry air to the flame.

The engineers have other problems, however; such as how to protect the flame from wind and rain, wax spilling, how to mix the waxes, etc.

Present plans call for the candle to burn at least the 100 days of the Centennial celebration.

Pendleton Man Hurt In Train Collision

Pendleton — (UPI) — Floyd Harriman, 50, Pendleton, escaped with cuts and bruises when his panel truck collided with a Union Pacific passenger train at a downtown crossing here Wednesday afternoon.

Harriman told officers a switching engine with box cars blocked his view of the passenger train. The Dornier City of Portland was held up for about 22 minutes.

The panel truck was partially crushed under the side of the train and carried about 50 feet down the tracks before being locked under a baggage car.

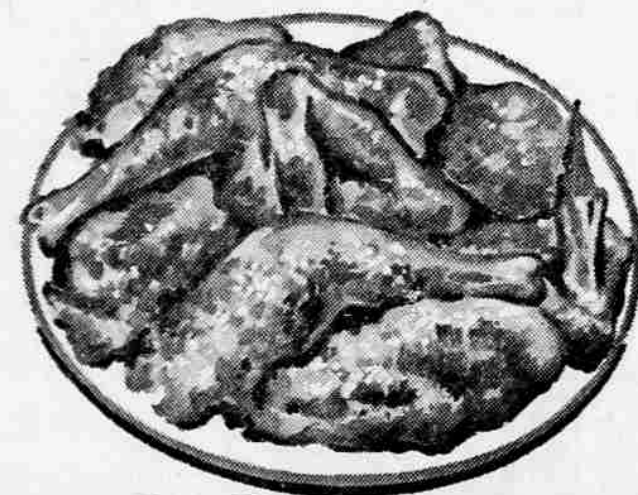

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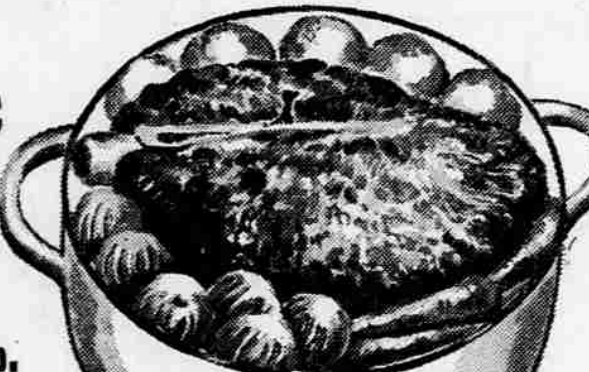

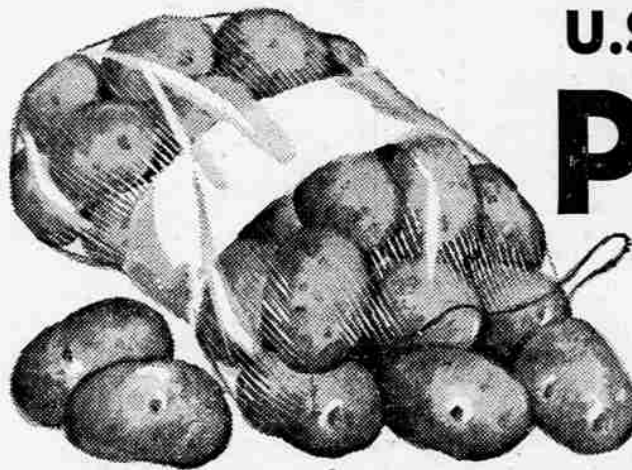
