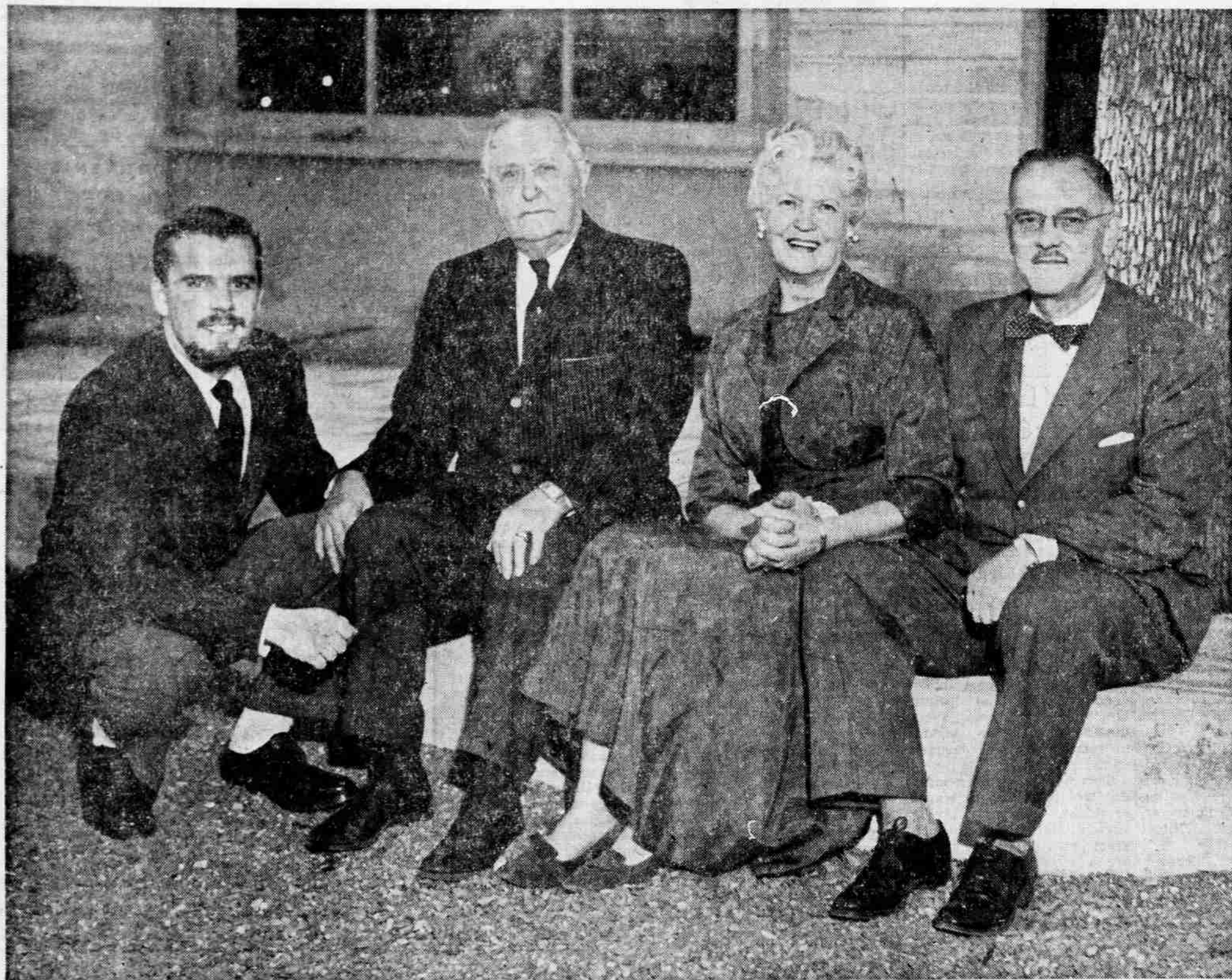


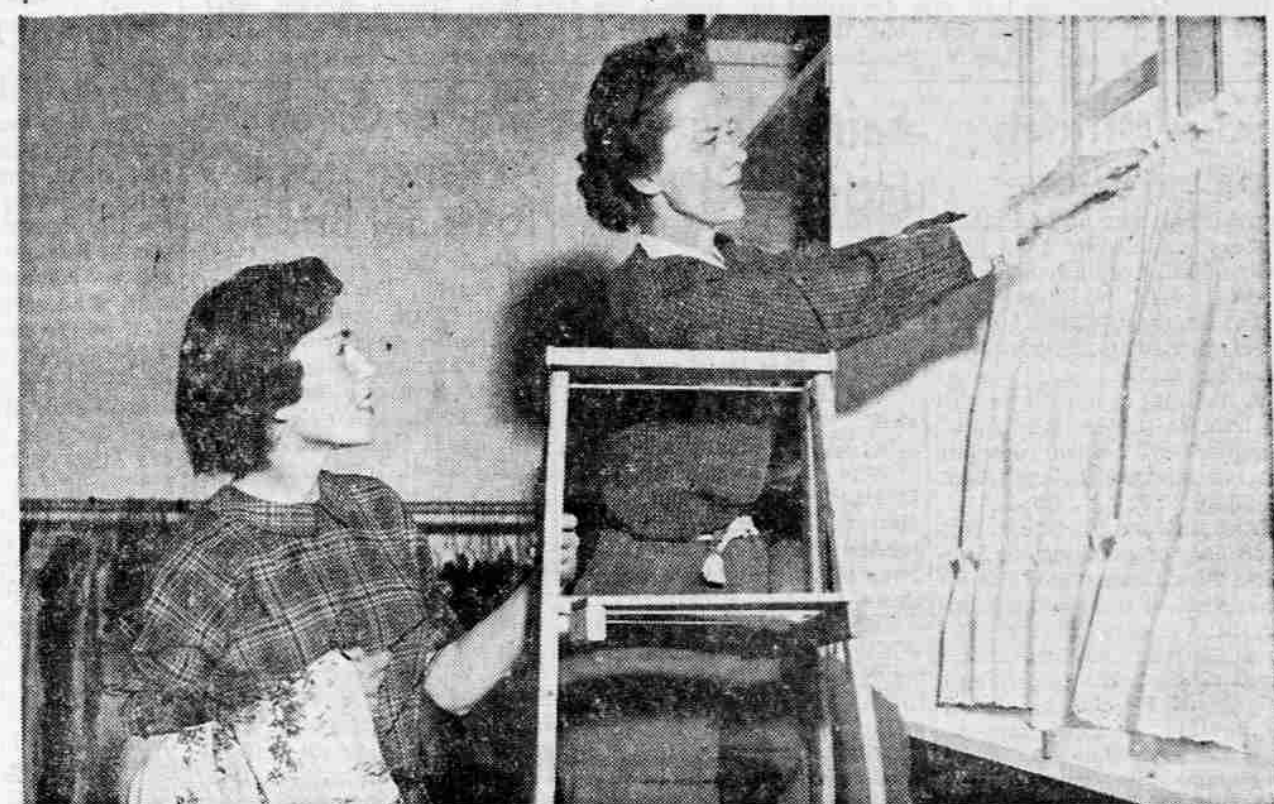
## In the News
