### European Unity Topic For University Women

International Relations study group presented the program at a recent meeting of Medford branch, American Association of University Women. The topic, "Keystones of European Unity", was illustrated by a filmstrip. As an introduction, Mrs. Hector Langdon outlined the general problem as it has been approached in the past and its current treatment.

Aspects of the subject were discussed by several of the group. Military and political aspects were presented by Mrs. Glen Guiley; economic unity, Mrs. James Cummins, unity through conquest, Mrs. William B. Johnston; problems and prospects, Miss Elizabeth McGalliard.

It was brought out that the five compelling factors pushing free Europe toward integration are an industrial renaissance, the shifting of world power relationships, the retreat of colonialism, the support of the United States through the Marshall Plan, and, finally, the fear of Soviet aims.

It was stated that, to date, the greatest gain toward unity has come in the economic field. This is evidenced by the Benelux Customs Union and the European Coal and Steel community. Now these same nations are embarked on the Common Market with the goal of wiping out all barriers to the free circulation of goods, capital and manpower. It is hoped that out of these steps a new Europe may be born, perhaps a European version of the United States.

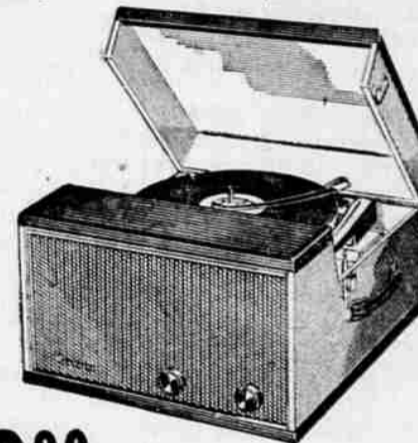

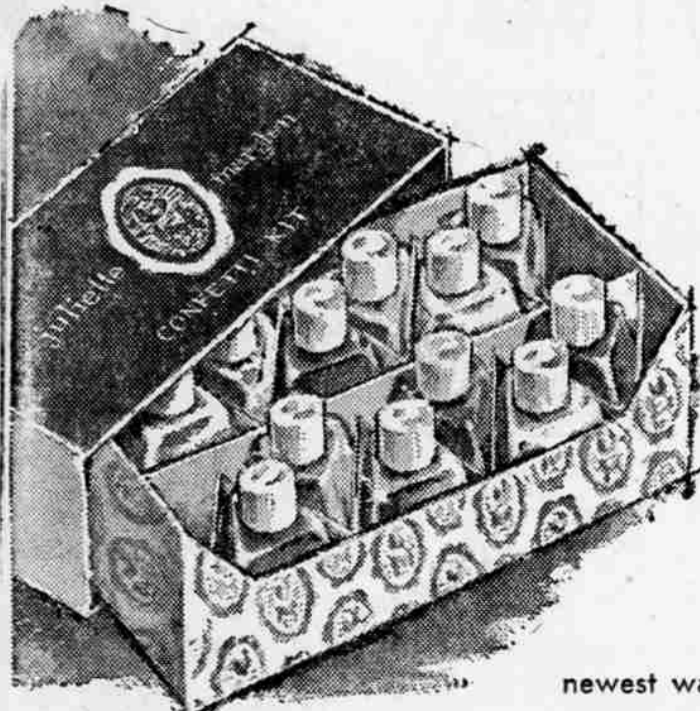
