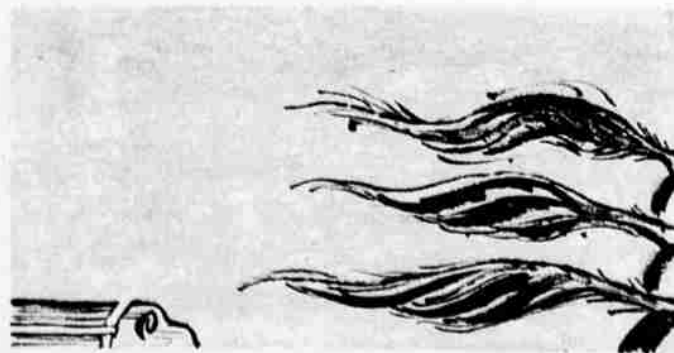

Unfortunately, I have never taken any pictures good enough to be printed in newspapers or magazines. But I do feel the captions, at least, would have been of reader interest:

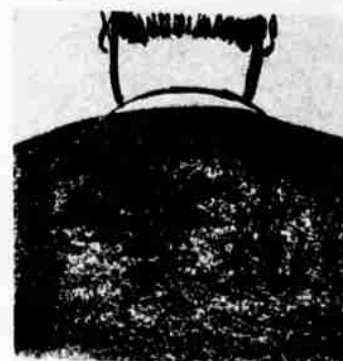
