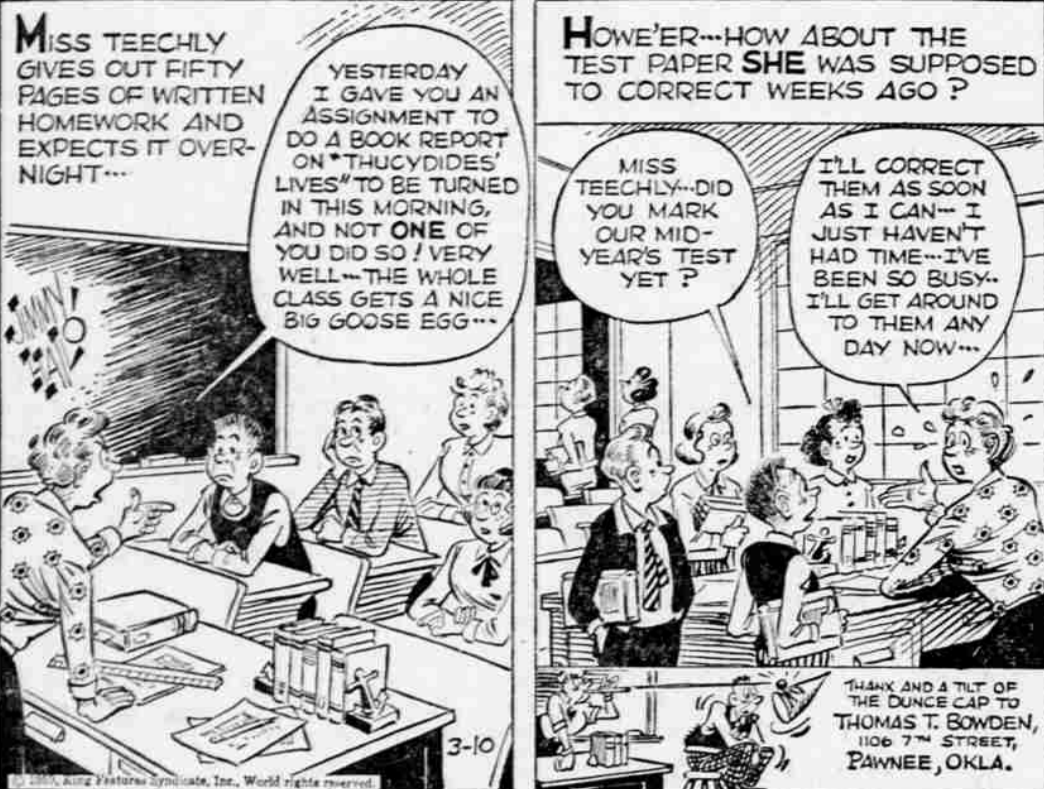

Portland—UPI—A bill calling for licensing and financing of an educational television station in Portland was outlined Monday to the State Board of Higher Education here.

Dean James W. Sherburne of the General Extension Division said the bill would be introduced in the Legislature Tuesday. The station, on channel 10, would be operated by the Extension Division.

Sherburne said the measure would authorize up to \$100,000 a year for the operation of the TV station and up to \$250,000 in capital outlay to establish it.

Last month an agreement was signed between the extension division and Community Television, Inc., of Portland which has worked several years to get the station in operation.

The Board's building committee approved preliminary plans for campus construction projects. They are dependent upon legislative appropriations.

Lower Medical Fee For Aged Requested

Portland—UPI—A mid-year meeting of delegates from the Oregon State Medical Society here has called for "reduced" medical fees for patients over 65 years of age with low family incomes. Delegates urged insurance carriers to develop prepaid hospital and surgical programs for senior citizens.

The group adopted a resolution pointing out the need for immediate further development of voluntary prepaid health insurance plans for persons over 65 who live on modest retirement incomes.

Delegates voted to have the 1950 annual meeting of the society in Portland Sept. 7-9.

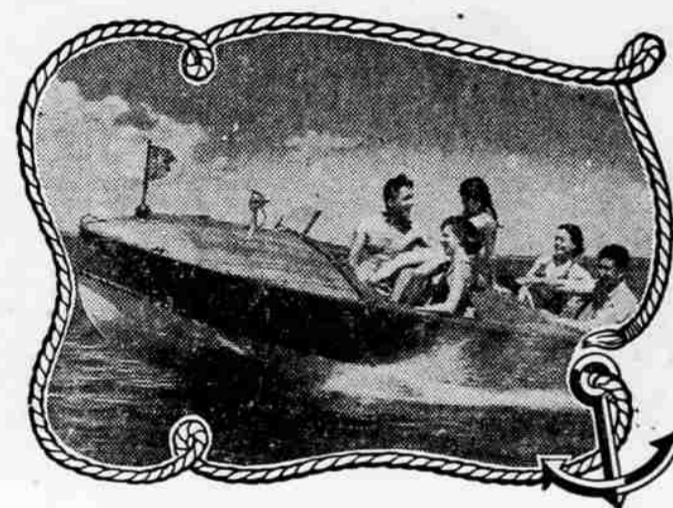

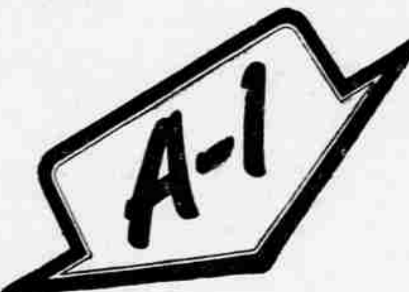
