

Appraisal Short Course Scheduled

Corvallis — County assessors, deputy assessors, and real estate appraisers from throughout Oregon will be enrolled in the fourth annual state appraisal short course March 23 to 27 at Oregon State college.

Started in 1956, the course is sponsored jointly by the state tax commission and the college to provide a continuing training program for appraisers and to help bring into valuation of real property across Oregon.

Appraisal of "downtown" business district properties and livestock ranches will be emphasized this year. Effects of widespread development of outlying city shopping centers on downtown business property values will be given special consideration. Last year's training stressed appraisal of property in suburban fringe areas.

In spite of everything that we doctors can do in the way of warning people to go for an examination when they find a lump somewhere, many people will put off the evil day. Many just can't bring themselves to face the truth. Many try to get around the problem by taking refuge in quackery.

The other day a woman with a cancer of her breast wrote asking for the name of an herb doctor. As I tell her, never have herbs cured a cancer.

Sometimes, when I see a woman who keeps putting off doing anything for a lump in her breast, I say, "If you won't save your life for yourself, why don't you do it for your husband and your children?" Many a time I have had a woman like this say, "Oh, I don't mind dying, it's all right." But then six months later, when she has severe pain all through her chest, and has lost a lot of weight, and is utterly miserable, she comes in and demands that I cure her. Then, of course, it is too late.

Also, because of the public's recent panic over the idea that ordinary diagnostic x-ray exposures are dangerous, some roentgenologists are refusing now to give x-ray treatments except for cancer.

A Lump in the Breast

A woman writes that two years ago she noticed some lumps in one of her breasts. As she says, "for one reason or another," she didn't do anything about them, and she still isn't doing anything

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
