

Ohio Valley Hit By Heavy Snows; Storm Heads East

A fast moving snow storm "clobbered" the Ohio Valley with up to nine-inch accumulations today and weathermen warned of heavy snow during the day in New York and Pennsylvania.

Heavy rains and tornado winds swept the southeast as colder air pressed southward. High winds demolished two furniture warehouses at Burns, Miss., while nearby, 150 children and their teachers huddled in a corner of their school as the winds "roaring like a tornado" raced by. No one was injured.

The snowstorm moved northeastward through the Ohio Valley during the night. The Chicago Weather Bureau reported the storm was "clobbering" Cleveland, Ohio, with six inches of snow on the ground early today.

Issue Bulletin Warning
The New York Weather Bureau issued a special bulletin warning the storm would deposit heavy snow in Pennsylvania, most of New York state, Connecticut and interior portions of New Jersey.

The prediction called for four to six inches of snow in the area up to eight inches at higher elevations. Hazardous driving conditions were expected in the storm belt.

Snow during the night occurred from Illinois, and Indiana through the Ohio Valley into the East Coast. Four or more inches were reported in southern Illinois and Indiana. Anesville, Ohio, got nine inches, the heaviest snowfall since 1950.

FFA Convention Set Next Week

Corvallis—Future Farmers of America from 89 Oregon high schools, including Crater, Eagle Point, and Phoenix, will participate March 18 to 21 in the annual State FFA Convention at Oregon State college.

Art Gardner is president of the Eagle Point chapter and Nat Etzel is FFA instructor and chapter adviser. Convention delegates are Steve Carroll and Elvin Hawkins. Phoenix chapter president is Leon Small. John Dube is FFA instructor and chapter adviser.

Approximately 500 FFA boys and their leaders will attend this year's 31st annual convention. Featured speaker will be Adin Hester of Aurora, national president of the Future Farmers of America this year. Hester was Oregon FFA president in 1957 and later won the national FFA public speaking competition.

Hugh D'Autremont Remains Critical

San Francisco—(UPI)—Hugh D'Autremont, paroled in January after serving 31 years in the Oregon state prison for murder in connection with a 1923 train robbery attempt, remained in critical condition in San Francisco General hospital today.

The illness from which D'Autremont suffers has not been disclosed.

His physicians said Wednesday he was transferred to the surgery ward pending further consultation on whether surgery was to be undertaken.
