The Pelican State Capitol has a set of marble steps leading up to the entrance. Each step bears the engraved name of a state.

The Medical Roundup

On Avoiding Strokes And Heart Attacks

Today, many of the men who have recovered from a heart attack, and a few of those who have had a stroke, are being given each day a dose of a drug of the Dicumarol type which tends to prevent further clotting of blood in the patient's arteries or veins. It seems wise for a person who has shown a tendency to such clotting to stay on the so-called anti-coagulant treatment for the rest of his days. This seems to be safe unless too much of the medicine is taken.

It is well to have a measurement of the so-called prothrombin time made at least once a month. A physician who is on the treatment tells me that he knows that he is taking too much of the medicine when, on nicking his face with his razor, he has trouble stopping the bleeding. Then he reduces the dose of the drug. If a man should, let us say, have an automobile accident in which a gas is inhaled in his leg, and he starts bleeding badly, he must quickly be given a dose of vitamin K1. Some patients who
