### Graham Scores Church Leaders

Melbourne, Australia—(UPI)—American evangelist Billy Graham last night scored "those Protestant church leaders who wash their dirty linen in public" by criticizing his Australian "crusade."  
 "One thing you can say for the Roman Catholic church is that they don't disagree in public as Protestants do," Graham told a crowd of 10,000 at the Melbourne show-grounds.

Graham has run into opposition from a few Anglican and other Protestant church leaders in Australia who criticized his methods of evangelism and contended his meetings did not have a lasting effect.

### Portlander Wins Gin Rummy Play

Las Vegas—(UPI)—A 71-year-old retired hardware salesman from Portland today pocketed almost \$20,000 for winning first place in the third annual International Gin Rummy Tournament.

Harry Wilmarth's exact winnings were \$19,542.91. He took the top prize by defeating the other finalist after two days of elimination play. In a 500-point game that lasted more than four hours, Wilmarth beat D.C. Zec, Atlanta, Ga., 506-475 Thursday.  
 Zec took home second place money amounting to \$9,728.66 plus \$90.91 from a player's pool.  
 The other semi-finalists were Lorayne Lamas, Los Angeles, and David Gertler, New Orleans, who was runner-up in 1957. They earned \$4,029.66 each.  
 Wilmarth today headed for Los Angeles and an appearance on a national television show after winning the tournament—said to be the world's richest card game.

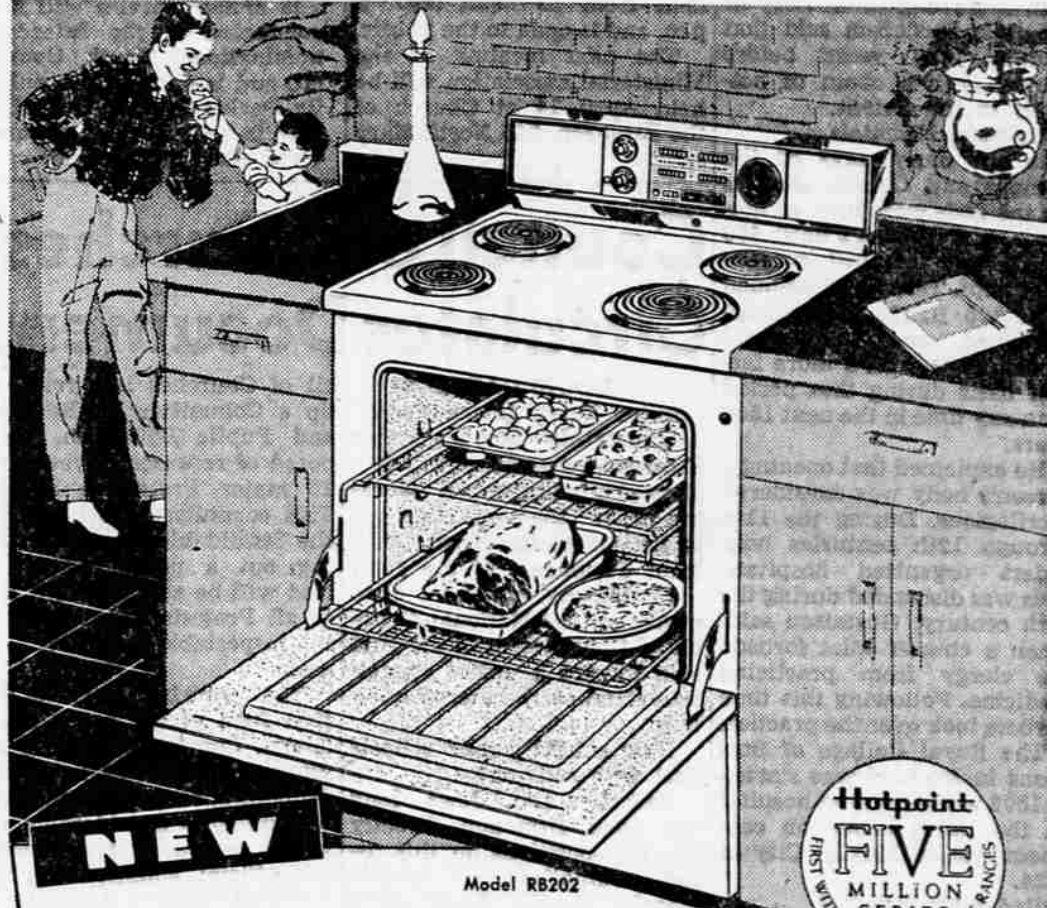

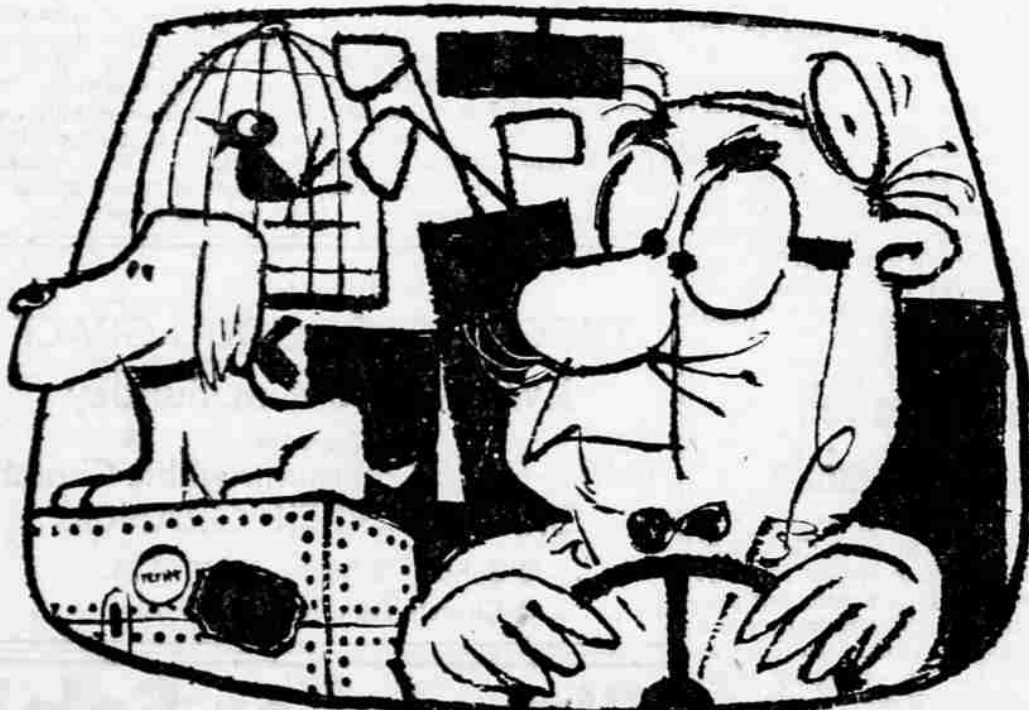

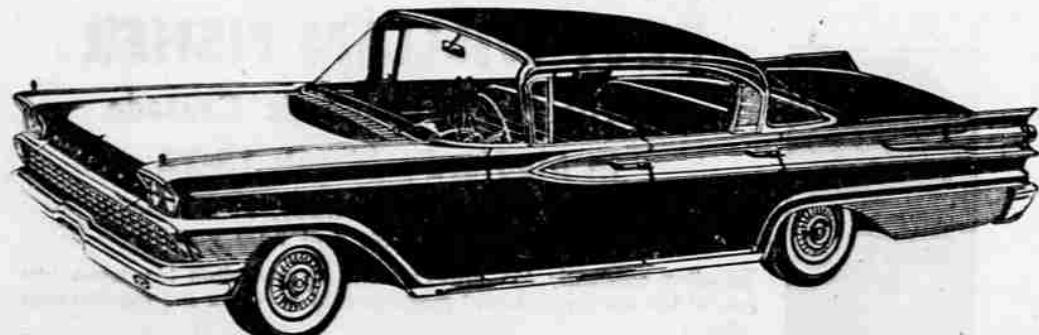
