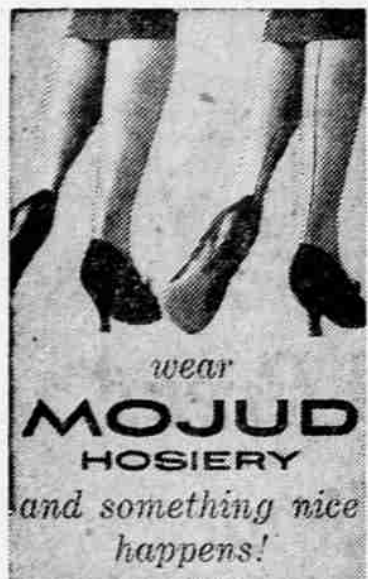


Meeting Announced For Adarel Chapter

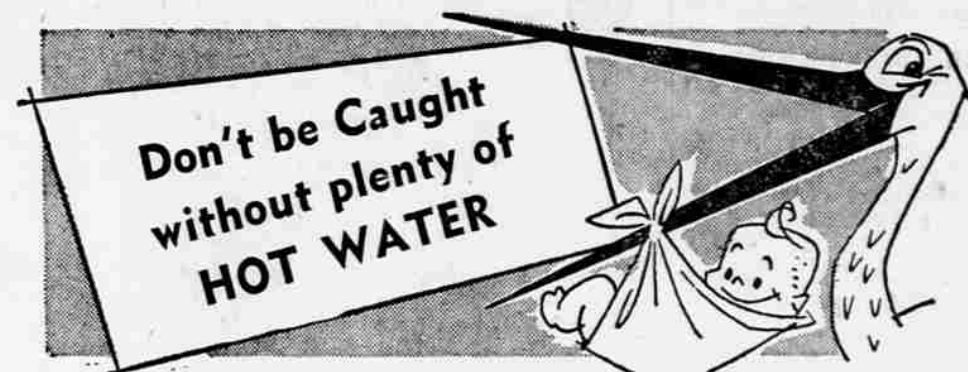
