

Salary Schedules Adopted at Talent

Talent—The Talent school board last week adopted a new salary schedule proposed by the Talent Teachers' association, according to R. B. Parr, superintendent of schools.

Parr said a few changes were made in the base salary and increments, using a percentage for steps in increments instead of set raises. The board also accepted teacher resignations and re-hired the faculty for the coming school year.

The board requested the Phoenix school board to take action "as soon as possible for a reorganization election to be held in the Talent-Phoenix districts" on consolidation.

The board noted that from a recent opinion poll in the Talent district, "the majority of the patrons of school district 22 indicated they wish to reorganize with the Phoenix school district 4 at the earliest possible date."

Bidding Heavy on Six Tracts Offered By BLM at Auction

Heavy bidding was received for three of the six tracts of timber offered for sale by the Medford district of the bureau of land management March 12. There was only one bid for each of the other three tracts.

The high bidder for a tract containing 5,699,000 board feet on Snow creek in Douglas county was Superior Lumber company of Glendale. They offered \$45 per thousand board feet for the Douglas-fir. Four other bidders competed in the oral auction sale.

Sunny Valley Lumber company of Grants Pass bid \$44.049.65 for 1,110,000 board feet of timber near Quines creek in Douglas county to top four other bidders. The offer included a bid of \$42.75 for the Douglas-fir.

Brown Brothers Lumber company of Williams offered \$40 per thousand board feet

for Douglas-fir in a tract containing 176,000 board feet of re-log timber located on the East Fork of Williams creek in Josephine county. The total bid of \$5,751 was higher than the offers of the other three bidders.

Only Bidder
The Robert Dollar company of Glendale was the only bidder for 5,159,000 board feet on Elk Valley creek in Douglas county, while Beagle Lumber company of Ashland submitted the lone offer for 19,000 board feet of logs near the Green Springs summit in Jackson county and Fred Starnes made the only offer received for 15,000 board feet of timber along the Dead Indian rd. in Jackson county. The last two tracts were both timber involved in clearing operations for parts of the Howard Prairie project.

On April 9, the Medford district plans to hold its first timber sale in its new office building at Riverside and Barnett rd. At that time, seven tracts will be offered for oral auction. They contain a total of 11,314,000 board feet which has been appraised at \$290,333.30.

Six of the tracts and 4,121,000 board feet of the volume are in Jackson county while the seventh, which contains 7,193,000 board feet is in Douglas county.

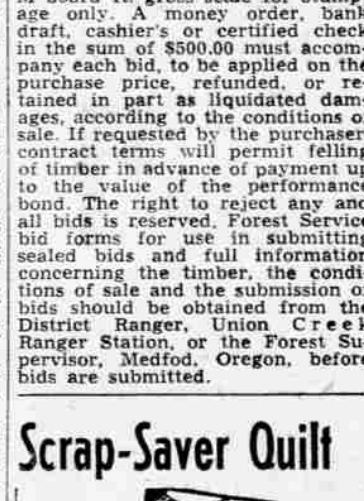

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, or his authorized representative at the office of the Forest Supervisor, National Forest Building, Medford, Oregon, up to and not later than 2:30 p.m., April 17, 1959, for all merchantable timber marked or designated for cutting on an area embracing about 5 acres, more or less, within section 28, T. 31 S., R. 3 E., W.M., surveyed, in the Union Creek Ranger District, Rogue River National Forest, Jackson County, Oregon. The estimated volumes are 80 M board ft. of Douglas-fir and 30 M board ft. of hemlock and other species. The minimum acceptable bid per M board feet is as follows: Douglas-fir \$38.05, hemlock and other species \$12.35. This includes the following stumpage rates per M board feet: Douglas-fir \$33.00, hemlock and other species \$12.30, plus \$2.20 for sale area betterment and \$0.80 for slash disposal for all species. In addition there is within the sale area an unestimated volume of Douglas-fir cull peeler material which will be paid for at \$3.00 per M board ft. gross scale for stumpage only. 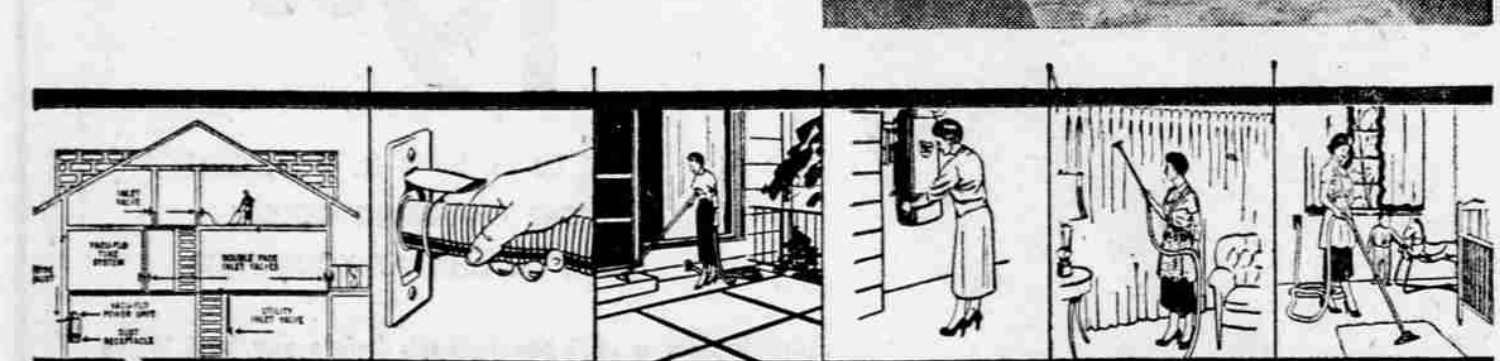
