

Civil War Veteran Dies at Age 112

Kingsport, Tenn.—(UPI)—"General" John Salling, 112, one of the last two surviving veterans of the Civil War, died today.

The old rebel, who would have been 113 on May 15, succumbed to pneumonia and old age at a clinic here, 23 miles from his home in Slant, Va., where he spent almost all his life.

Salling's daughter, Mrs. Hugh McCamy and his grandson, H. E. Hawkins, both of Slant, were with the old soldier when he died.

The southwest Virginia mountaineer, who enjoyed good health even after he passed his 110th birthday, contracted influenza Thursday and was brought to the clinic. Pneumonia followed and he grew gradually weaker.

Salling's death leaves Walter W. Williams, 116, as the only surviving veteran of the War Between the States. Williams, bedridden and totally blind, lives in Houston, Tex., with a daughter.

Can Herbs Cure Cancer?

Recently I received a letter from a woman with an apparently scattered cancer, who asked me to refer her to a good old herb doctor, because she had an idea that he might cure cancers which we doctors can't help.

Today, I find an article by Usha C. Dalal, Alfred Taylor and G. F. McKenna of the University of Texas School of Medicine. They have been studying the effects of extracts of many American plants and herbs to see if these extracts will have any effect on growing cancer cells. The scientists have to report that "None of the plant extracts processed to date have given results which promise practical application to cancer chemotherapy." There are a few of the extracts which have a little effect, and these will now be studied with care. Some of the chemicals isolated from the herbs kill cancer cells, but they kill normal cells about equally well. Obviously, what we must have, if we are going to cure cancer, is a substance which will kill cancer cells but not the normal cells of the body.

A Good Diet Usually Supplies The Necessary Vitamins

According to a recent report of the highly respected and authoritative Council on Foods and Nutrition of the American Medical Association, most people who are not food-faddists, living on freck diets, or who are not close to starvation, need not worry about taking extra vitamins in pill form because they are getting enough of them already. Experts tell us that vitamins are something like keys in a lock—they make possible certain important chemical changes in the body, and when a man has eaten enough vitamins with his food to make these changes possible, it is doubtful if more vitamins can do him any good.

Some people, in their great desire to improve their health or cure some disease, stuff themselves or their small children on huge doses of vitamins, and in so doing get into

Two Escape Injury In Belly Landing

La Grande—(UPI)—A B-25 fire-fighting plane made a safe belly-landing late Saturday after its nose gear had jammed. No one was injured.

Eldon Downs, manager of the La Grande airport, brought the plane in safely after flying around to consume fuel. Downs, and his copilot, Lyle Flick, La Grande, are both veteran pilots of World War II.

Several attempts were made to pass hydraulic fuel from a Cessna 180 to the B-25 but they failed.

The nose gear had stuck in a three-fourths down position when Downs first attempted to make a landing.

He then flew over the airport several times and dropped messages to the ground. The plane was not equipped with a radio.

Downs said the plane would be junked because it would be too costly to repair.

The plane's undercarriage was damaged in the landing.

Mine, Smelter Union Convenes

San Francisco—(UPI)—The 54th convention of the International Union of Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers opened here today with some 250 delegates in attendance.

The delegates, representing 80,000 members in the U. S. and Canada, are observing the 66th anniversary of the Mine-Mill's existence as the dominant union in the non-ferrous metal mining industry.

Sessions will continue through Saturday.

It will be the first convention in three years at which an overall collective bargaining program for the hard-rock mining industry will occupy the main attention of the delegates.

The non-affiliated union has been operating under three-year contracts signed in 1956 with the major copper, lead and zinc producers. The contracts terminate this summer.

Yakima Man Heads Pine Association

San Francisco—(UPI)—J. D. Bronson, Yakima, Wash., will serve as new President of the Western Pine Association.

Bronson headed a new slate of officers elected Saturday as the association ended a four-day convocation.

Other officers elected included Charles T. Gray, San Francisco, J. B. Edens, Phoenix, Ariz., vice presidents; R. W. Rehfeld, Phoenix, Ariz., treasurer, and S. V. Fullaway Jr., Portland, Ore., secretary-manager.

Earlier in the final day's session, outgoing president A. B. Hood told the 450 delegates that "we expect the Western lumber producing business to be at least 5 percent above the 1959 column."

The association represents 350 lumber manufacturing firms in 12 Western states.
