

Porter Distributes Oregon Daffodils

Washington—Fifteen thousand King Alfred daffodils grown in Oregon were distributed today to President Eisenhower and members of Congress by Rep. Charles O. Porter (D-Ore.). The golden Centennial samplings of Oregon came from members of the Umpqua Daffodil Growers who yearly ship five million daffodils throughout the nation.

The daffodils were freshly cut in the "light bud" stage. They were shipped from Oregon Sunday, March 8.

Porter told his colleagues the daffodils "brilliantly illustrate part of the beauty of Oregon during this Centennial (or any other) year. The Golden West abounds in gold—only a part of it beneath the ground."

The Medical Roundup

What Happens With Social Medicine?

Many people, when angered at us doctors, tell me that they are going to work hard to introduce Social Medicine into this country.

Then, as they say, "You doctors will be servants of people, and as such, will have to do just what we tell you to do."

Because of this threat of enslavement of the medical profession, I am always interested to read what European doctors have to say about their experience with Socialized Medicine.

In a recent number of the New England Journal of Medicine, I find a remarkable article by Dr. John T. Laing, who for eight years worked as a general practitioner under the British system.

As he says, when the British law went into effect, immediately the waiting-rooms of physicians became crowded, and "often-frivolous" house-calls were requested day and night. Millions of prescriptions were demanded, and soon the doctor came to be looked upon much as a civil servant, like the postman or policeman. Patients told the doctor how he was to treat them, and soon he saw that the best and safest way out was to do what he was told to do.

If he had the courage to stand up to patients, they could easily make it hot for him. They could report him to the Government, and hence today, as Dr. Laing says, the doctor is literally blackmailed by the patients who know their power.

And the poor doctor is so over-worked that he cannot possibly devote any time to a patient; he can't even stop to examine him. He cannot order laboratory work, or an electrocardiogram, or an x-ray study. This can be done only in a hospital. If a patient has some acute illness, needing hospitalization, the general practitioner sees no more of him. Obviously, the general practitioner has almost no incentive to study or to try to do good medicine. He cannot possibly do good medicine, and after seeing perhaps 130 patients in a day, he has no time or energy left for any study. Most of his day is spent filling out forms for the bureaucracy in London.

Pays for Lawsuits

One of the worst things that happened to the doctors was diabolical. If a patient wants to make a little money, all he has to do is sue his doctor for malpractice. It won't cost him anything, because the Government will pay the lawyer! As one might have expected, this has forced doctors to avoid doing anything like lancing a boil for which they could conceivably be sued. They pass the buck to the emergency doctors in the hospitals. But these doctors got sued so often that they had to go out of business, and now it is hard for a hospital to find a doctor foolish enough to work in an emergency ward.

Some readers may ask, "But what happens if a doctor works hard and tries to get extra training so that he can qualify as a specialist?" Dr. Laing says that there are heart-breaking obstacles in the way of any ambitious doctor's getting ahead. Naturally, most of the doctors who have been caught on this killing treadmill are unhappy. Many with whom I have talked have told me that they keep trying to save up

enough so that they can escape, perhaps to Canada or Australia or South Africa. As these doctors say, the last thing they want now is to see their sons go into medicine.

Worries About Cost

Yes, I know, medicine in America is far from satisfactory, and it is costing so much that many people cannot afford it. I worry about this, and I don't know what the answer is going to be. I don't know who is to blame. The other day a poor widow told me that just her bed in a hospital ward had cost her \$20 a day!

The other night I heard a man protesting violently because he said his doctor had charged him \$10 for a house call. The man beside him said, "That isn't so bad; the man who came out to replace a tube in my Hi-Fi set charged me \$13.50." Another man said, "Saturday night, during the below-zero cold snap, my furnace quit working. The repair man came out charged me \$30 and I paid him gratefully."

Another man said, "When a square foot of plaster fell off the ceiling in my office downtown, the man who came and in a few minutes replastered the spot charged me \$75. He said he had had to pay his hod carrier and his truck driver each a full day's wages." The prominent men present, some of them physicians, some hospital administrators, and some business men—all agreed they didn't know what the answer is to be.
