Stock Market Higher With More Volume

New York-UPU-Chemicals, oils, metals and drugs combined today to send the stock market sharply higher on increased volume.

Favorable economic forecasts, firmness in prices for some commodities and a generally optimistic economic picture helped to buoy the market.

Coppers met support on further price firmness for the red metal. Kennecott and Phelps Dodge rose more than a point each and hit new highs. DuPont sparked the chemicals with a gain of more than five at its high. Eastman, Allied and Union Carbide also were strong.

New Scholarship Fund Established

A new scholarship is being established at Harvard college with an eye to attracting high school graduates from Oregon.

The scholarship is named for David McCord, executive secretary of the Harvard Fund Council. McCord, noted for his poetry and essays, lived from 1911 to 1913 on the Rogue river at Footh Creek.

He was graduated in 1917 from Lincoln High school, Portland.

James N. White, a Boston investment counselor, has established the scholarship to provide financial aid for undergraduates "who have demonstrated unusual creative ability and stamina in writing, or in music, painting, drawing or sculpture."

White has expressed hope that "other things being equal" the scholarship might be awarded on occasion to students from Lincoln High school or other Oregon high schools.
