### Grange News

#### Enterprise Grange

At the last regular meeting of the Enterprise Grange 50 visiting members from Granges throughout Jackson County were present. This is the second meeting in a series of visitation meetings recently inaugurated by the Jackson County Pomona Grange. The purpose is to arouse greater interest in Grange work and closer relationship among the various Granges in the county.


