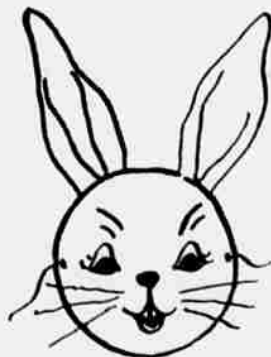

To make a bunny mask you will need one paper plate, one sheet of paper from which to cut the ears, a few pipe cleaners for whiskers, and a piece of string.

First draw a rabbit face on the plate. Cut out places for eyes, nose, and mouth. Paste on paper ears. Attach whiskers with tape or by poking an end of pipe cleaner through the plate and bending the end back. Tie on the strings and you are ready to become a make-believe Easter Bunny!



EASTER IS COMING!

Display an assortment of colorful birds on an Easter egg tree! Use hard-boiled or blown eggs. The birds are simple to make. Use cellophane tape to attach small feathers for wings and a tail, and then tape on a piece of construction paper for the neck and head. Draw in the eyes and beak. Take the feathers off an old hat or substitute pleated colored tissue or crepe paper for wings and tail if you have no feathers. To make the tree, break off a small branch from a tree in the back yard—one with as many twigs as possible—and place in a flower pot with plaster filler and water. This will hold the tree branch firmly in position after it hardens. Hang the eggs on the branches with a loop of cellophane tape which has been placed on each side of the egg. Then cover the plaster with shredded green cellophane or crepe paper and your tree is finished.

LET'S DRAW AN OSTRICH

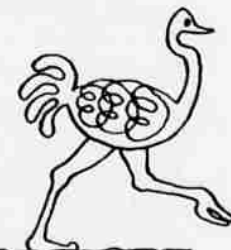

HOW TO MAKE A TELEPHONE
