CHILD MURDERERS

Dr. Melitta Schmideberg reported studies which convinced her that the type of child who commits a murder

doesn't think that it is anything to feel guilty or unhappy about. He is the sort of child who feels that anyone who has injured him in any way ought to be murdered.

The child feels perfectly justified in having retaliated. How unfortunate it is that today parents let their children

reveal in television shows in which people are constantly being shot and murdered and hanged. Why shouldn't some of the children so educated every day grow up to be murderers?

Persons Easily Hypnotized

According to a recent note by Dr. Ernest R. Hilgard, of Stanford university, the most easily hypnotized persons are those who are well-adjusted. One would have thought the easily-hypnotized would be

the submissive, "follower" type of person, but Dr. Hilgard says "No." He made his studies on 74 students. Those who were found easiest to hypnotize, and those hardest to hypnotize were then studied by psychiatrists.
