Miss Tyler Serves As Page in Salem

13 States Face Loss of House Seats in Census

Washington—UPI—Thirteen states face the loss of House seats and presidential elector votes because of population shifts and the granting of statehood to Alaska and Hawaii.

A census bureau projection of the results of next year's population count, which starts April 1, 1960, shows that California is expected to pick up seven seats. Florida would gain four.

The reshuffle of House seats will take effect with the 1962 elections. The first presidential election affected will be in 1964. A state gets one presidential elector for each representative and senator.

Would Cost 19 Seats
The expected reapportionment would result in 19 seats being lost by the 13 states. New York and Pennsylvania would suffer the greatest loss, with three each.

Arkansas and Massachusetts would lose two each while one seat would be taken from each of three states: Alabama, Georgia, Iowa, Kansas, Maine, Minnesota, Mississippi, North Carolina and West Virginia.

Only six states are expected to gain House seats. In addition to the gains in California and Florida, one seat each would be picked up by Hawaii, Michigan, Texas and Arizona.

Although 19 seats would be lost, only 17 would be gained by other states. This is because the reapportionment would reduce the House to its permanent 435 seats from the temporary 437 created by the admission of Alaska and Hawaii.

Hawaii, voted into the union with one representative, would get two under the projected census results. Alaska would keep the one House seat it gained with statehood. The expected shift seats would leave New York still with the largest representation in the House, 40. California would be in second place with 37 as Pennsylvania dropped to third with 27.

WRONG INSPECTOR

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Deadline Nears for Vets' Education

Salem—The spring term of college, starting in late March and early April, may be the last opportunity for many Oregon World War II veterans to use the state veterans' educational benefits program because the deadline for starting the benefit is June 30.

The deadline applies to World War II veterans only, Franklin G. Reynolds, educational officer for the state department of veterans' affairs, said. No deadline has been established for Korean veterans. Reynolds said that in general, the only schools a World War II veteran can wait until June to enroll in and still beat the deadline would be the regular daytime summer sessions in the independent and state colleges, and private business colleges and technical schools which operate a summer program.

To qualify for the state benefit, an applicant must have been an Oregon resident for one year immediately prior to his military service in either World War II or during the Korean conflict. He must also be an Oregon resident when he applies.
