

Medford Youths Admit Burglaries In Rogue Valley

Two Medford youths, ages 16 and 17, who were arrested Saturday by Medford city police for taking an automobile, have admitted several other burglaries and thefts in the valley, according to police.

The boys, either separately or with two other Medford boys, aged 15 and 17, admitted breaking six gum-ball machines at various locations in Medford during past several years.

The two boys admitted to breaking into the Oakdale Market warehouse, 401 South Oakdale ave., March 21, 1958, and setting garbage cans on fire near the high school as well as a telephone pole on Main st. Other fires they claimed they set were two or three trees in various yards and on one instance admitting pouring lighter fluid around a chimney on a house and setting it afire.

Other Damages
Other malicious damage committed and admitted by the quartet were the slashing of a roof of a convertible, rifling glove compartments of cars parked at the Plaza apartments; shoplifting phonograph records from two music stores; taking a fifth of vodka from a pickup; theft of five books from the Medford public library which were thrown away; theft of a bundle of newspapers from the Greyhound bus depot which they threw into a garbage can; and shoplifting from Groceries Food Store and Woolworth's.

Two of the boys admitted breaking off radio aerials from cars parked at the Plaza apartments as well as in Grants Pass during the Medford-Grants Pass football game.

The boys also told police they had taken five packages from an automobile parked at the Greyhound bus depot last week and a roll of tickets from a pickup at the same location.

The 16 and 17 year old youths who admitted the car theft are being held in the county detention home. The other youths were released to their parents pending action by juvenile authorities. Police reported that investigation is still underway regarding similar incidents of malicious damage in the valley during the past several years.

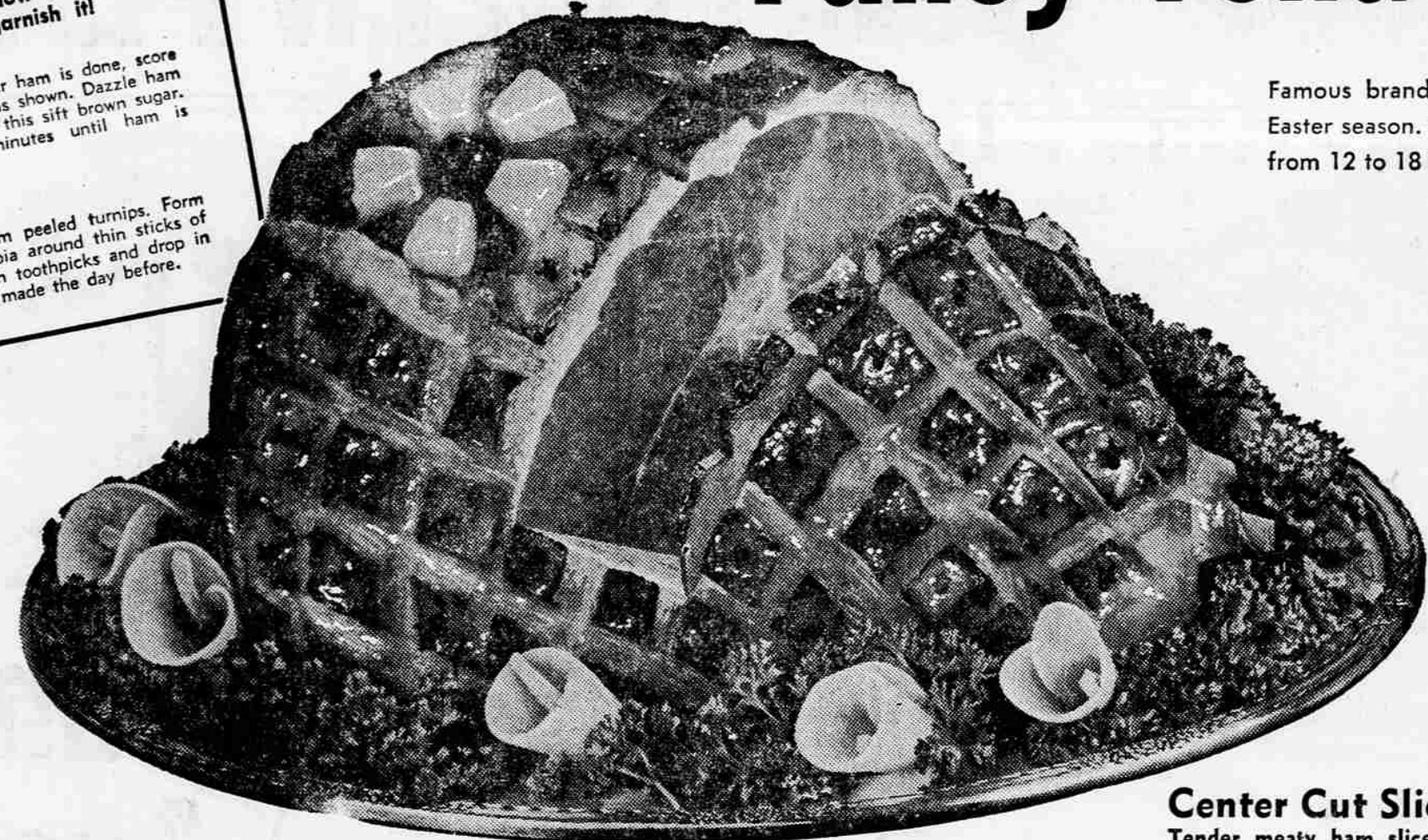
