Bank Debits Show Increase in Area

Eugene — Bank debits in southwestern Oregon in February totaled \$64,822,563, about 14.9 per cent above February a year ago. The total was 11.5 per cent below the January figure.

The debit statistics were compiled by the University of Oregon bureau of business research from records of 11 banks in Jackson, Josephine and Curry counties. Debits represent the dollar value of checks drawn against the deposit accounts of individuals and business firms. They are regarded as indicators of business activity.

In the entire state, records of 167 banks showed a February debit total of \$1,627,991,013, an increase of 9 per cent from February a year ago, and a decrease of 15.3 per cent from this January.

759 Students Enroll At Southern Oregon

Ashland — A total of 759 students has enrolled thus far at Southern Oregon college for the spring term, which started Monday, college officials have announced.

Last year at this time, there were 699 enrolled. Of the total, 475 were men, compared to 447 last year, and 284 were women. Last year at this time there were 252 women enrolled.

Registration for the spring term will continue until April 4.

Verdict Affirmed, Judgment Upheld By Supreme Court

Salem — (UPI) — The Oregon Supreme Court Wednesday affirmed a verdict for \$45,626 recovered from Mixermobile Manufacturers by Leonard A. Elston for personal injuries resulting from the collapse of a high tower manufactured by the company.

The opinion written by Justice Pro Tem Orval J. Millard upheld a decision of Multnomah County Circuit Judge James R. Bain.

The high court held the jury had been properly instructed in the case.

Living Costs Dip During February

Washington — (UPI) — Living costs dipped slightly in February because of some lower food prices, the government reported Wednesday.

The Labor Department's consumer price index slipped one-tenth of a point from its January reading of 123.8 to a February level of 123.7. The index is based on 100 as a 1947-49 average.

At this level the index was 1 per cent higher than a year ago, the smallest 12-month increase in three years but still

the highest February reading ever.

Only small changes in the index, probably upward, were predicted for the next few months.

The world merchant marine fleet grew by 7,787,650 tons in 1958, according to Lloyd's Register of Shipping, which said this was the largest annual increase since 1948.

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
