

De Gaulle Serves Notice on Russia

Paris—(UPI)—President Charles de Gaulle served notice on Russia Wednesday that if passage to West Berlin is blocked "the Soviet troops stationed in Germany would have to deal with the western powers to deal with."

De Gaulle, speaking at the first press conference ever given by a French chief of state, plunged directly into the question of Berlin.

More than 600 newsmen from all over the world attended.

De Gaulle confirmed he must attend an East-West summit conference, which he said "must be prepared and

could only operate in an atmosphere of calm."

"I am entirely in agreement with what President Eisenhower has said on this subject," he said.

The Medical Roundup

A Wonderful Description Of Migraine

Often it is a joy when in some old book I find a perfect description of a disease that I know well. When I was in London, I went into an enormous old bookstore and one of the first books I picked up was a rare one that I had, for long wanted to own. It was E. Living "On Megrin or Sick Headaches." He wrote it in 1873. He wrote well because he suffered from migraine himself. As Plato said some 2,000 years ago, a physician can do the best job of treating a disease if he has had it himself.

Living wrote, "A young

woman in the enjoyment of excellent health, well nourished, cheerful and active, the life perhaps of her family circle, appears in the morning, once in every two or three weeks, an altered being, with a pale inanimate face, full lustreless eyes, and with all her usual cheerfulness departed; and so remains throughout the day in a state of chronic nausea, and corresponding mental and bodily dejection, to which use alone has made her resigned; and yet the following morning she will be her former self again as if nothing had occurred; and thus she may continue to live two distinct lives, as it were, perhaps for a long series of years."

In the translation of an ancient book written by the Sumarians some 5,000 years ago, I found a perfect description of someone with migraine, with a headache and pain in his blurry eyes. In two books by famous physicians who lived about the time of Christ, again I found perfect descriptions of migraine. Fortunately, today, there is a drug that usually will block the coming of a spell. I have written a booklet on the subject.

The Port-Wine Birthmark

Someone writing to the American Medical association, asked what to do for a little girl, a month and a half old, who has a red port-wine type of birthmark covering much of her left hand, shoulder and neck. The family doctor said that he had received so many different opinions from different experts as to what could or should be done that he was puzzled. The expert who was chosen by the editor to answer the question said that he thought the best treatment for such lesions is "alpha ray therapy," given with thorium-X. At intervals for from six to 24 months an alcoholic solution or lacquer can be painted on the affected area. With this, the chances are 50-50 that the child will be helped. Encouraging is the experts' statement that he doubts if any further children this couple may have will have a birthmark.
