

Committee Votes To Transfer All Dalles Patients

Salem—UPB—The Joint Ways and Means Committee voted 10-3 Wednesday to transfer all tubercular patients at The Dalles TB hospital to the Salem TB hospital. It instructed its staff to prepare a bill to that effect.

A subcommittee headed by Sen. Francis Ziegler (R-Corvallis) recommended that the hospital in The Dalles be used for care of elderly patients now confined in state hospitals at Pendleton and Salem. Sen. Edwin Durno of Medford, a physician, said he felt as a medical man that with a decline in tubercular patients the facility at The Dalles could be better utilized for care of geriatric patients.

Vigorous Protests
Both Sen. Ben Musa and his wife, Rep. Katherine Musa, The Dalles Democrats, made vigorous protests against the subcommittee report.

They said a report of five citizens headed by Oregon City Publisher E. P. Kaen had recommended continuation of The Dalles hospital in the treatment of tubercular patients.

Dr. Durno said the State Board of Health, the Oregon TB Association and the Oregon Health Officers Association had gone on record in favor of using the Salem TB hospital in place of the one at The Dalles.

Those voting against the motion to introduce the bill were Reps. Verne Cady (D-Burns), Stafford Hansell (D-Athens), and Keith Skelton (D-Eugene).

Hearing Aid Fee Hearing Aids Manufacturers

Salem—UPB—Manufacturers of hearing aids flew in some talent to testify Wednesday against a bill to license persons fitting hearing aids.

If the bill should pass, Oregon would be the first state in the union to license such dealers.

Manufacturers and dealers in hearing aids oppose the bill which is favored by a citizens committee represented by Portland attorney Leo Smith.

More Time Asked
Lee Watson, Minneapolis, executive vice president of the hearing aid conference, asked members of a ways and means subcommittee for two more years to see if manufacturers couldn't police their own dealers.

He said his association, representing 90 per cent of major hearing aid manufacturers, was revamping its code of ethics to prevent misrepresentation and was setting up national boards of arbitration and certification.

Frank J. Blanchard, Los Angeles, general manager of the hearing aid division of Zenith Radio Corporation of California, testified his dealers were instructed to tell their customers to see a doctor before fitting aids.

Licenses \$25
Under questioning from Sen. Edwin Durno, Medford physician, Blanchard said that manufacturers did not have complete control over dealers and that dealers could not "make a person go see a doctor" before fitting a hearing aid.

Proponents, represented by Smith, said all that the bill required was that salesmen have competence in fitting aids and follow ethical practices already laid down by the Federal Trade Commission.

Smith said not much progress had been made in cleaning up the industry to date.

The bill calls for a board of examiners with licenses costing \$25 a year.

Graham To Preach In New Zealand

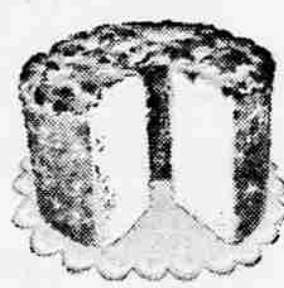
