The Medical Roundup

Diseases Produced by Doctors

When a doctor, by some unwise statement, causes a terribly worrisome person to become ill, perhaps for months or years, we physicians speak of an iatrogenic disease. Iatro is Greek for a physician and genic means produced by.

I can remember with great regret times in my medical life when, by inadvertently mentioning some harmless peculiarity that showed up in an x-ray film or a laboratory report, I unwittingly caused an insupportably worrisome person to put in years of suffering. The fact that I kept telling him over and over again that I did not think that the finding that I had mentioned was a sign of disease, or was anything to worry about, didn't seem to help her at all.

One of the worst things that a physician can do when the usual test for syphilis is reported on the borderline of normal is to ask a nice woman—perhaps the gracious mother of five stalwart sons—if she ever had syphilis. Often, after that, no matter what the doctor does, or how many dozen tests he has made in which the report comes back "negative" (meaning normal), the woman never feels clean again. I have known many such women who spend the rest of their days going from doctor to doctor getting more Wassermann tests made, or asking for treatment for the supposed syphilis. The wise and kindly doctor will always repeat such a borderline test more than once before he tells the patient about it. He will tell her of it only when he has become satisfied that it means something.

Alcoholic Gastritis

Recently I saw a physician who always had been a terribly worrisome man—a man who apparently liked to worry about diseases which he certainly didn't have. One day it occurred to him that since he had been taking a glass of wine with meals, he might have an alcoholic gastritis. This, of course, was preposterous. Even most of the men on skid row, who drink at least a pint of cheap whiskey a night, haven't any gastritis.

At any rate, the doctor immediately went to a gastroscopist who pushed a lighted tube down into his stomach and looked around. Because the gastroscopist couldn't see anything wrong, he remarked on the fact that the rubber tip on his instrument had, in one place, scratched the mucous lining of the stomach and caused it to bleed a little. As he said to the doctor-patient, "This doesn't mean a thing, and the scratch will be healed up in a couple of days."

But the patient immediately was scared to death; he decided that he must have a serious stomach ulcer; and he immediately went on a diet, consisting of nothing but milk. When he was down to skin and bones, he came halfway across the continent to see me. I had a hard time talking him out of his fear, and getting him back again on three square meals a day.

Iatrogenic Disease

Hundreds of thousands of persons get an iatrogenic disease when some doctor says he heard a murmur in the heart, or found some slight, harmless change in an electro-

cardiogram. Often, what the doctor comments on are changes in the person's body that come with age—much like his gray hair, his bald head and his paunch.

A woman came in to see me—in a terrible stew. She decided a couple of months ago, when she turned 60, that she ought to go to a doctor—for one of these general check-ups she'd heard about. She always had been strong as a horse, and had never had any sickness. The doctor made the usual tests and said he hadn't found anything except a little increase in her blood cholesterol. With this, the woman became tremendously alarmed because she had read that an increase in cholesterol goes with hardening of the arteries, and heart attacks.

Her doctor immediately tried to undo the harm he had done, by saying that she really didn't have much of an increase in the blood cholesterol; and he certainly didn't think there was anything to worry about. He said that if he had it, he wouldn't do anything about it. But the woman was, by now, so alarmed that she insisted on going on a fat-free and cholesterol-free diet. The doctor told her that experts say it is silly to go on a cholesterol-free diet; but to humor her, he took her off of all milk, all dairy products, eggs, ice cream, butter and cakes.

He told her to come back every week and he would check her blood pressure. This he did, but now the woman is all-to-pieces because he hasn't sent her for further measurements of her blood cholesterol. "Why doesn't he try to find out if I am better? Perhaps I still have so much fat and cholesterol in my blood that I am headed for a bad heart attack or a stroke!"

I had several measurements of blood cholesterol made and found them all to be a little high for a young woman, but not for a woman of 60. As I told her, if I had that amount of cholesterol in my blood, I would be well pleased and would quit fussing. Unfortunately, by now, the woman is so mentally unsettled that she doesn't know whom or what to believe. I am pretty sure she isn't going to believe me. What I fear is that she will keep shopping around from doctor to doctor until she finds one who is a terrible pessimist, and who will scare the proverbial "daylights" out of her. Then she may even take to her bed with supposed illness. I have seen it happen.
