Vandenberg AFB, Calif.—UPI—The Air Force may conduct a stepped up schedule of two "Project Discoverer" satellite launchings monthly from May through October, it was learned today.

The Advanced Research Projects Agency previously announced one satellite launching would be held monthly but delays which postponed shots in December and January were believed part of the reason for the expected accelerated program. A shot tentatively set for this month also is believed behind schedule and now appears destined to be postponed.

Back Stairs: A Georgia Trip for Ike

Washington—UPI—Back stairs at the White House:

More than a few people close to President Eisenhower certainly wish he'd pull stakes and head south for about a week of hot weather and golf.

Unless their arguments become suddenly more persuasive, the indications are that he won't do it. Not right away, at any rate.

With the President handling major foreign affairs personally, the growing momentum of Congress and a steady stream of important visitors, even his usual April trip to Augusta, Ga., now is in some doubt.

Not having gotten much exercise in the past four months, Eisenhower seems to have gained two or three pounds during the winter. This isn't serious, but he does need exercise, according to his friends.

Decision Soon

Normally he goes to Augusta the day after the finish of the Masters Golf Tournament which, barring a tie, should wind up this year on April 5.

A decision on whether Eisenhower can get away probably will be made by the middle of next week. If he does decide to go to Georgia, it doesn't seem likely that he'll fly back April 9 for the opening day baseball game in Washington.

If this turns out to be the case, it will be the first opening day game he has missed. He almost missed in 1953, much to the consternation of the baseball world. He was in Georgia at the time and had made it pretty plain that he would not come back for the

game.

The opener was postponed because of rain, however, and the President was on hand for the rescheduled contest about a week later.

Bus Enters Gates

No one seemed to know quite why, but last Monday morning a bright yellow school bus rolled through the south gates of the White House and up to the portico.

The bus paused briefly, apparently picked up one or more passengers, and then proceeded out of the grounds.

It seemed unlikely that a bus would be calling for the Eisenhower grandchildren since they go to school near their home in Alexandria, Va.

It could be, however, that some of their classmates were getting a V.I.P. tour of the White House.

Four-Way Vaccine Program Favored

Washington—UPI—The Public Health Service gave its blessing Thursday to a four-way vaccine providing protection for preschool children against polio, diphtheria, tetanus, and whooping cough.

But Surgeon General Leroy P. Burney told a news conference the service is withholding its judgment of a new "live virus" antipolio vaccine reported to have been tried effectively in other parts of the world.

Burney said the use of the "live virus" serum has been under "serious investigation" for several years. But, he added, many more questions must be "answered and resolved" before it meets PHS standards.

Burney told reporters the new four-in-one vaccine provides "safe and effective" protection against the four diseases.

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Spray Meeting Set For Next Thursday

A highway spray meeting will be held Thursday, April 2, at 9:30 a.m. in the Jackson county fairgrounds, Gene Winters, Jackson county extension agent, has announced.

The meeting will be one of several in cooperation with the state highway department, the state department of agriculture and Oregon State college. The Medford session is being held to train highway spray crews of Jackson and Josephine county, but all persons interested in weed and brush control are invited, the agent said.

Ray Hubbell, Jackson county weed supervisor, will review local weed problems. Bark Astrup will explain the state highway department's weed program. Bill Koesan, state department of agriculture agronomist, will speak on spraying highways. Rex Warren, farm crops specialist, Oregon State college, will cover the chemicals to use to meet particular conditions.

John Couch of the Du Pont company will point out the need for good equipment for good weed control. George Moore of the state department of agriculture will report on the ragweed program. Spray damage and spray loss problems will be discussed by Ray Kelso, state department of agriculture.

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DEPORTATION BILL

Washington—UPI—The House Immigration Subcommittee has approved a bill to make it easier for the government to deport undesirable aliens. The bill, identical to one which the House approved last year, would crack down on drawn-out legal proceedings used to block deportation of aliens.

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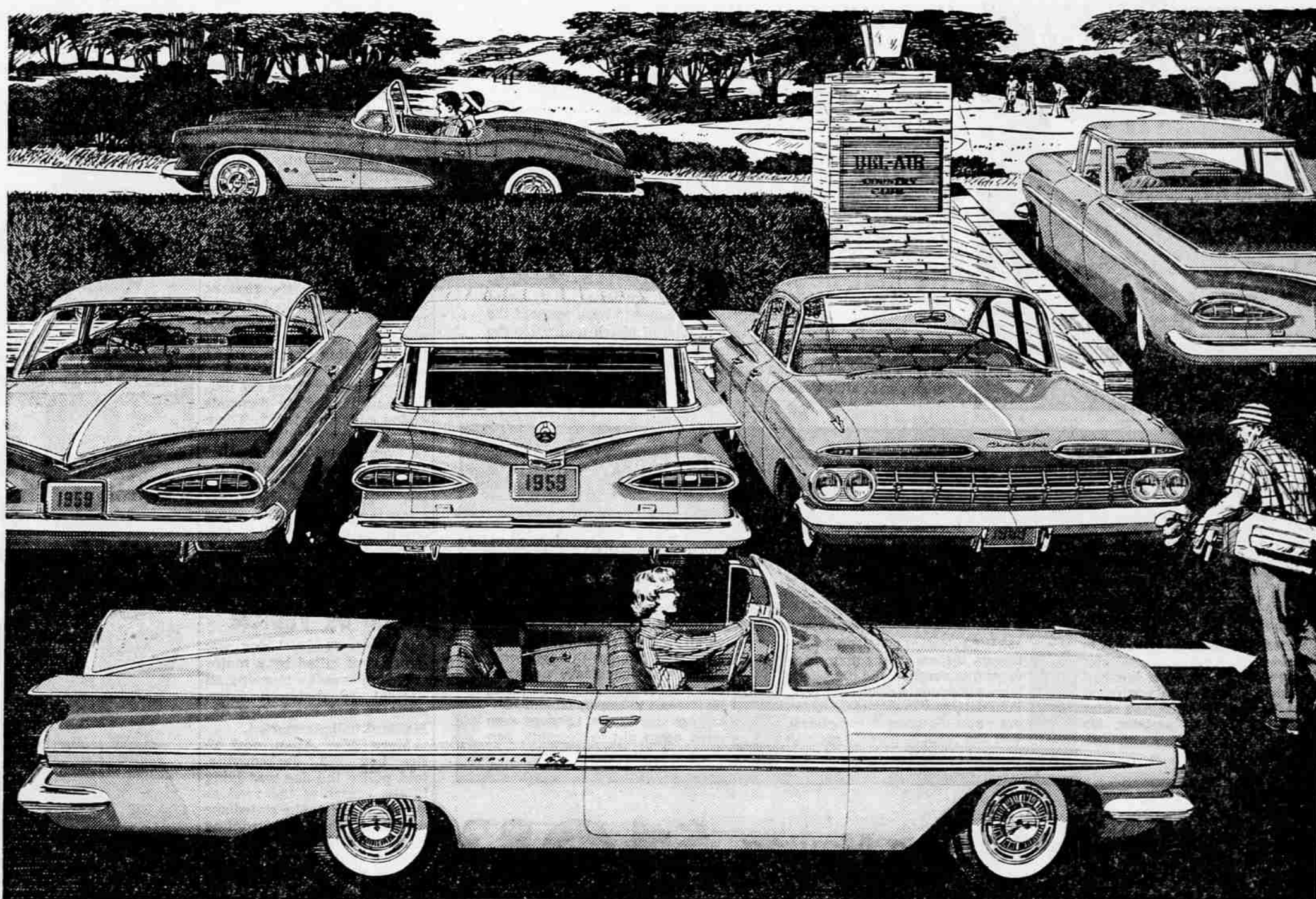
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
