Monte E. Lasater, 69, of Seattle, Wash., died Saturday following a heart attack. Mr. Lasater, an ordained evangelist with the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, was conducting a series of missionary meetings at the local church at the time of his death.

He was born July 8, 1889, in Lockwood, Mo., and had been a member of the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints since 1920. He was ordained a priest in 1922 and an elder in 1925.

In April, 1934, he was ordained to high priest and held the office of bishop of Columbia River for 21 years. He was ordained an evangelist April 12, 1956.

He is survived by his wife, one son and a daughter, all Seattle.
